I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to:

- **A) Adopt** a Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida, approving the submission of a Section 5311 Formula grant application for \$358,111 to partially offset the operational costs for Routes 40 and 47 in the Glades Region, as administered by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT);
- **B)** Authorize the Mayor of the Board of County Commissioners to execute the grant application, supporting documents, and assurances.

Summary: FDOT has notified Palm Tran of an allocation of Section 5311 grant funds for mass transit operating assistance in non-urbanized areas. If awarded, the grant will partially offset the operating costs of Palm Tran's fixed route service in the Glades Region of Palm Beach County. The application is for \$358,111 in grant funds which require a local match of \$358,111 (50% of project) for a total project cost of \$716,222. The Grant match is included in the proposed FY 2021 Budget. The grant application contains an indemnification provision that differs from that adopted for use by the County under PPM CW-F-049. The grant application requires the County, to the extent permitted by law and in accordance with the provisions of 768.28, Florida Statutes, to indemnify, defend and hold harmless FDOT and all of its officers, agents and employees from any claim, loss, damage, cost, charge, or expense arising out of the County's non-compliance with the application's assurances, including that of its officers, agents or employees. exception to the PPM has been approved taking into consideration the County's need to provide the services, the amount of the grant award, County's current performance of such services and liability for its acts, and the non-waiver of sovereign immunity beyond the statutory caps of 768.28, Florida Statutes. District 6 (DR)

Background and Justification: FDOT has been designated by Florida's Governor to administer the Section 5311 Program. Objectives of the funding for intercity bus service under Section 5311 is to support the connection between rural areas and the larger regional or national system of intercity bus service. Additionally, it provides support services to meet the intercity travel needs of residents in rural areas and support the infrastructure of the intercity bus network. This is an annual formula based grant.

> Palm Beach County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida is the largest of the 67 counties in Florida. Palm Beach County borders Martin County to the North, the Atlantic Ocean to the East, Broward County to the South, Hendry County to the West, and Lake Okeechobee to the Northwest. According to the Census 2017 estimates, 1,426,772 people claimed Palm Beach County as home. The eastern County has a thriving urban area while the western area of the County is more rural with a large area of intensive agricultural production including sugarcane, vegetables and nursery products.

In Palm Beach County, Fixed Route Public transportation and door-to-door paratransit service to eligible riders is provided by Palm Tran, an entity created by the County. Palm Tran's Mission is to provide access to opportunity for everyone; safely, efficiently and courteously. Palm Tran's vision is to be the premier transportation choice in Palm Beach County. The Board of County Commissioners serves as the Board of Directors for Palm Tran. Palm Tran is currently operating 32 fixed routes. Service covers the eastern portion of the county as far north as the Town of Jupiter and as far south as Boca Raton with one route crossing to Broward County connecting with Broward Service. One route travels to the western boundary of the County where it connects with rural circulator routes, Fixed and Deviation serving the communities of Belle Glade, Pahokee, Canal Point and South Bay. In addition, Palm Tran CONNECTION operates complementary paratransit service as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended.

Palm Tran's Executive Director and staff manage the system's operations and are responsible for transportation (Fixed Route and Paratransit), project planning, grant applications, administration, and reporting.

Palm Tran's operations conducts all training involving Fixed Route personnel, Palm Tran Connection oversees the Paratransit contractors, and keeps records of the required training for their personnel. The Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners is responsible for insurance of all transit assets.

Palm Tran operations service is funded through Palm Beach County Ad Valorem, gas tax, rider's fares, Block Grant, Service Development Grants and the Section 5311 Rural Grant.

Paratransit Services: Provided during the same times to all eligible customers for all trip types and purposes. Palm Tran Connection program is a door-to-door paratransit service that provides transportation to eligible seniors and persons with disabilities in Palm Beach County.

- •Staffing: New Bus operators are trained on ADA requirements, mobility devices, securement, lifts, priority seating, annunciator devices, etc.
- •Records and Vehicle maintenance-Palm Tran staff is responsible for all vehicles maintenance. The mission of the maintenance department is to provide operations with safe reliable and clean vehicles, ready for service. The Fleet Management system is a county electronic system used to manage Preventive Maintenance requirements, schedules, reports and work orders.
- •System Safety Plan. Palm Tran Management, and the Safety and Training Division are charged with the responsibility to implement, devise and coordinate a comprehensive System Safety Program Plan (SSPP) with specifics and activities to prevent control and resolve unsafe conditions which may occur as a result of our operations. This Authority includes the right to temporarily suspend any operation which may be determined to be hazardous or creates an unsafe condition.

- •Drug-free workplace. Palm Tran's employees are our most valuable resource. It is our policy (1) to take appropriate action to ensure that employees are not impaired in their ability to perform assigned duties in a safe, productive, and healthy manner; (2) to foster and maintain a drug and alcohol free environment for all employees and patrons; (3) to prohibit the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of controlled substances; and (4) to encourage employees to voluntarily seek professional assistance whenever personal problems, including alcohol or drug use, may adversely affect their ability to perform their assigned tasks. To achieve the goal of a substance-free workplace, this policy incorporates three integrated components: Prevention through education and training; Detection, deterrence and enforcement; Treatment and opportunities for rehabilitation.
- •Data collection methods: Ridership Data is collected with automatic passenger counters (APCs), AVAIL System. The use of electronic data was certified by FTA in July 2017.

The goal of the project is to maintain the same level of service in the rural areas of Palm Beach County. The Glades area poses a challenge for transit, because its communities, the largest of which is Belle Glade, are located far apart from one another, and from the main developed area of Palm Beach County along the coastline. This means that transit routes serving the area must traverse extensive areas of undeveloped land in order to reach places with people, jobs and destinations that generate travel demand. To connect these communities with the eastern part of the County, Palm Tran offers service on Route 40 that travels to the Intermodal Center in West Palm Beach. Local service is provided with Route 47.

Fall of 2018 marked the end of a grant funding a portion of locally operated circulator transit service in the Glades. As a result, Palm Tran service in this area was restructured so that there is just one local route connecting to Route 40, Route 47, which operates now with more frequency, servicing both downtown Belle Glade, West Tech, Glades Service Center, Canal Point, South Bay and Pahokee. In addition, Palm Tran launched the Go Glades service on December 2018, a route deviation service, providing four (4) circulator for the area to connect to Palm Tran routes, and the service also offers Dial a Ride service, to schedule a pick-up for those who are unable to access the bus stops. Section 5311 funding supplements the increasing costs of providing service in this economically disadvantaged area

TECHNICAL, AND FINANCIAL CAPACITY

Palm Beach County has a total of 11,832 Employees (County Administration, Sheriff, Tax Collector, Property Appraiser, Clerk & Comptroller, Supervisor of Elections, Judicial, Inspector General and Palm Tran), the departments working on this project include:

The Budget Division prepares and administers the County's annual budget in accordance with Florida Statutes and policies of the Board of County Commissioners, and fulfills an oversight role on behalf of County Administration and the Board of County Commissioners.

Palm Tran

Public transportation service is implemented by Palm Tran's experienced project management team and technical experts in transit operations, with oversight by the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners. Palm Tran, with 629 employees, uses private sector consultants and contractors to design and construct infrastructure projects and its own staff to provide operations and maintenance services for its fixed route fleet of 142 large, heavy-duty transit buses (low floor 35' – 40' and larger including articulated buses).

Palm Beach County is the recipient of Section 5307 funds; Palm Tran manages these funds for the County. Palm Tran is responsible for the compliance with FTA requirements, and reporting of Milestones progress, Financial reports, NTD, DBE, Title VI, EEO, etc.

(c) If this grant is not fully funded, can you still proceed with your transportation program? Explain.

Palm Tran will continue to provide Public Transportation Service in the rural area of Palm Beach County. The availability of financial resources may determine the number of daily trips that can be completed.

Palm Beach County will continue to allocate funding dedicated to providing public transportation. Palm Tran is

responsible for developing a budget that provides coverage for the service area, continuous funding will ensure frequency remains at the current level of service.

Palm Tran devotes a strong majority of its capital and other resources to preventing service failures or interruptions and ensuring the critical safety of passengers, while recognizing the need for more agile, expansive and competitive transit assets. Section 5307 funds cannot be used by Palm Beach County for operating expenses.

> Palm Beach County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida is the largest of the 67 counties in Florida. Palm Beach County borders Martin County to the North, the Atlantic Ocean to the East, Broward County to the South, Hendry County to the West, and Lake Okeechobee to the Northwest. According to the Census 2017 estimates, 1,426,772 people claimed Palm Beach County as home. The eastern County has a thriving urban area while the western area of the County is more rural with a large area of intensive agricultural production including sugarcane, vegetables and nursery products.

In Palm Beach County, Fixed Route Public transportation and door-to-door paratransit service to eligible riders is provided by Palm Tran, an entity created by the County. Palm Tran's Mission is to provide access to opportunity for everyone; safely, efficiently and courteously. Palm Tran's vision is to be the premier transportation choice in Palm Beach County. The Board of County Commissioners serves as the Board of Directors for Palm Tran. Palm Tran is currently operating 32 fixed routes. Service covers the eastern portion of the county as far north as the Town of Jupiter and as far south as Boca Raton with one route crossing to Broward County connecting with Broward Service. One route travels to the western boundary of the County where it connects with rural circulator routes, Fixed and Deviation serving the communities of Belle Glade, Pahokee, Canal Point and South Bay. The goal of the project is to maintain the same level of service in the rural areas of Palm Beach County. The Glades area poses a challenge for transit, because its communities, the largest of which is Belle Glade, are located far apart from one another, and from the main developed area of Palm Beach County along the coastline. This means that transit routes serving the area must traverse extensive areas of undeveloped land in order to reach places with people, jobs and destinations that generate travel demand. To connect these communities with the eastern part of the County, Palm Tran offers service on Route 40 that travels to the Intermodal Center in West Palm Beach. Local service is provided with Route 47.

Fall of 2018 marked the end of a grant funding a portion of locally operated circulator transit service in the Glades. As a result, Palm Tran service in this area was restructured so that there is just one local route connecting to Route 40, Route 47, which operates now with more frequency, servicing both downtown Belle Glade, West Tech, Glades Service Center, Canal Point, South Bay and Pahokee. In addition, Palm Tran launched the Go Glades service on December 2018, a route deviation service, providing four (4) circulator for the area to connect to Palm Tran routes, and the service also offers Dial a Ride service, to schedule a pick-up for those who are unable to access the bus stops. Section 5311 funding supplements the increasing costs of providing service in this economically disadvantaged area

Palm Beach County has a total of 11,832 Employees (County Administration, Sheriff, Tax Collector, Property Appraiser, Clerk & Comptroller, Supervisor of Elections, Judicial, Inspector General and Palm Tran), the departments working on this project include:

The Budget Division prepares and administers the County's annual budget in accordance with Florida Statutes and policies of the Board of County Commissioners, and fulfills an oversight role on behalf of County Administration and the Board of County Commissioners.

Palm Tran

Public transportation service is implemented by Palm Tran's experienced project management team and technical experts in transit operations, with oversight by the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners. Palm Tran, with 629 employees, uses private sector consultants and contractors to design and construct infrastructure projects and its own staff to provide operations and maintenance services for its fixed route fleet of 142 large, heavy-duty transit buses (low floor 35' – 40' and larger including articulated buses).

Palm Beach County is the recipient of Section 5307 funds; Palm Tran manages these funds for the County. Palm Tran is responsible for the compliance with FTA requirements, and reporting of Milestones progress, Financial reports, NTD, DBE, Title VI, EEO, etc.

Palm Tran will continue to provide Public Transportation Service in the rural area of Palm Beach County. The availability of financial resources may determine the number of daily trips that can be completed.

Palm Beach County will continue to allocate funding dedicated to providing public transportation. Palm Tran is responsible for developing a budget that provides coverage for the service area, continuous funding will ensure frequency remains at the current level of service.

Palm Tran devotes a strong majority of its capital and other resources to preventing service failures or interruptions and ensuring the critical safety of passengers, while recognizing the need for more agile, expansive and competitive transit assets. Section 5307 funds cannot be used by Palm Beach County for operating expenses.
