I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: Amendment No. 2 to the Contract for Consulting/Professional Services Southern Region Water Reclamation Facility (SRWRF) Engineering Services for Headworks and Effluent Transfer Pumping Improvements (Contract) with Hazen and Sawyer, P.C., (Consultant) to extend the term of the Contract for an additional 365 calendar days and for a not to exceed amount of \$69,828.58.

Summary: On July 12, 2016, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approved the Palm Beach County Water Utilities Department (PBCWUD) Contract (R2016-0905) with Consultant to provide engineering services during the design, permitting, bidding and construction phases for the Southern Region Headworks and Effluent Transfer Pumping Improvements (Project) at SRWRF. Amendment No. 2 will extend the term of the Contract to accommodate delays experienced in the construction of the Project and includes additional construction phase services necessary to support PBCWUD in successfully constructing the Project. The additional construction phase services include: construction progress meetings, responses to requests for information (RFIs), review of contractor payment requests, review of change orders and resident project representative support. This Contract was procured under the requirements of the 2002 Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Ordinance (R2002-0064) prior to the adoption of the new Equal Business Ordinance on October 16, 2018. The SBE participation goal established under the 2002 SBE Ordinance was 15% overall participation. The Contract provides for 20% SBE participation. Amendment No. 2 includes 21.53% participation. The cumulative SBE participation including Amendment No. 2 is 34.93%. Consultant is headquartered in New York, New York, but maintains an office in Palm Beach County from which the majority of the work will be undertaken. The Project is included in the PBCWUD FY20 budget. (PBCWUD Project No. 15-095) <u>District 5</u> (MJ)

Background and Justification: On July 12, 2016, the BCC approved a contract with Consultant for professional engineering services including design, permitting, bidding and construction phase services for the Contract (R2016-0905). On September 12, 2017, the BCC approved a Contract with Kirlin Florida, LLC, (Contractor) for the construction of the Project (R2017-1357). On July 2, 2019, the BCC approved Amendment No. 1 to extend the term of the Contract an additional 274 calendar days. The Project has experienced delays in construction and the Contractor continues to forecast additional schedule slippage. Amendment No. 2 extends the term of the Contract 365 calendar days and adds funds to allow the Consultant to continue to support PBCWUD through the completion of the Project. Once complete, the Project will increase the removal/capture efficiency of the screening processes and reduce the risk of damage and premature failure of plant equipment.

In consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, the COUNTY and the ENGINEER agree that the Contract for Consulting/Professional Services entered into by the parties on July 12, 2016, and referenced by County Resolution Number R2016-0905 (hereinafter "the CONTRACT"), is amended as follows:

- 1. The project schedule set forth in Article 2 included an original completion of services date of August 16, 2019, which was extended in Amendment No. 1 to the CONTRACT (R2019-0965) for an additional 274 calendar days to May 16, 2020. The project schedule of the CONTRACT is hereby extended by an additional 365 calendar days to reflect a new completion of services date of May 16, 2021. All schedules, tables, charts, or other items of the CONTRACT containing the project schedule are hereby similarly amended to reflect a new completion of services date of May 16, 2021.
- 2. The modified Scope of Work is contained in Exhibit A2 attached hereto and made a part hereof for the additional services contained in this Amendment No. 2.
- 3. The compensation as provided in the CONTRACT was for a lump sum fee of \$664,100.00 plus a not to exceed amount of \$622,570.00 for a total of \$1,286,670.00. The not to exceed amount was increased from \$622,570.00 to \$774,852.61 in Work Task Order No. 1 (R2019-0323) for a total of \$1,438,952.61. The lump sum fee of \$664,100.00 and the not to exceed amount of \$774,852.61 were increased to \$688,728.74 and \$984,576.33, respectively, in Work Task Order No. 2 (2019-1907) for a total of \$1,673,305.07. Amendment No. 2 will increase the not to exceed amount by \$69,828.58 from \$984,576.33 to \$1,054,404.91 for a total of \$1,743,133.65. The modified Schedule of Payments is contained in Exhibit B2 attached hereto and made a part hereof for the additional services contained in this Amendment No. 2.
- 4. The modified SBE schedules 1 and 2 are contained in Exhibit C2 attached hereto and made a part hereof for the additional services contained in this Amendment No. 2.

All other provisions of the CONTRACT, as modified Amendment No. 1, Work Task Order No. 1, and Work Task Order No. 2, shall remain unchanged by this Amendment No. 2 and shall remain in full force and effect.

WUD Project No.: 15-095

Project Title: Southern Region Water Reclamation Facility Engineering Services for

Headworks and Effluent Transfer Pumping Improvements

INTRODUCTION

On July 12, 2016 Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners (COUNTY) entered into an agreement entitled Contract for Consulting/Professional Services Southern Region Water Reclamation Facility Engineering Services for Headworks and Effluent Transfer Pumping Improvements – Palm Beach County Water Utilities Department (WUD) Project No. 15-095 (CONTRACT) with Hazen and Sawyer, P.C. (ENGINEER) to provide engineering services for design, permitting assistance, bidding support and construction services.

BACKGROUND

The above referenced professional services are related to WUD's Southern Region Water Reclamation Facility (SRWRF). The project aims to enhance operational efficiency by replacing aging infrastructure in the pretreatment building and the effluent pump station. The scope for this project includes, but is not limited to, replacement of three (3) existing influent screens with four (4) new center flow band screens and associated upgrades to the screenings handling and disposal systems (such as screenings washer/compactors, screenings conveyance, and truck trailer loading modifications). In addition, the project includes the replacement of the sole existing twenty-five (25) horsepower effluent transfer pump with a new 200 horsepower vertical turbine pump with associated variable frequency drive to match existing 200 horsepower effluent transfer pumps. The new effluent transfer pump has been pre-purchased by the WUD.

The CONTRACT with ENGINEER had an initial completion date of August 16, 2019. The construction phase of the project commenced on October 27, 2017 and is approximately 90 percent complete. Amendment No. 1 to the CONTRACT which was approved by the COUNTY on July 2, 2019 extended the CONTRACT duration an additional 274 calendar days due to the impact of delays experienced during construction of the project. The additional 274 days included in Amendment No. 1 resulted in a revised CONTRACT completion date of May 17, 2020. The Project continues to experience delays in construction and forecasts additional slippage to the construction schedule. Amendment No. 2 will extend the term of the CONTRACT an additional 365 calendar days and provides additional engineering services during construction to provide continued engineering support and assistance with the construction of the project. The additional construction services included in Amendment No. 2 are associated with supplemental meetings, submittal reviews, Contractor Requests for Information (RFIs), preparation and review of requests for proposals, and resident project representation. A more detailed summary is presented below.

ADDITIONAL CONSTRUCTION PHASE SCOPE OF SERVICES

Task 4 - Construction Contract Administration Services

The ENGINEER will provide additional services as identified below for the management of engineering tasks for the additional 365 day duration of the project's construction phase. Such management activities will include project coordination with COUNTY, general coordination with the Contractor, scheduling, pay requests, and general correspondence with COUNTY and the Contractor.

4.1 – Pre-Construction and Monthly Progress Meetings

ENGINEER will attend meetings with COUNTY and the Contractor. As a minimum, one (1) representative of ENGINEER will attend the project progress meetings (i.e., the Project Manager) together with the Resident Project Representative (RPR) to discuss the project progress. ENGINEER will chair the progress meeting and prepare and issue meeting minutes. Additional ENGINEER or sub-consultant team members will attend periodically to address specific subject matter as issues arise during the course of the construction work.

The original CONTRACT, Work Task Order No. 1, and Work Task Order No. 2 had assumed a combined total of 42 progress meetings. At the request of WUD, project progress meetings are held bi-weekly. Based upon biweekly meetings, eight (8) additional meetings are anticipated for the additional 365 calendar day duration of the construction phase of the project.

4.2 - Submittals

ENGINEER will consult with the COUNTY concerning the acceptability of substitute materials and equipment proposed by the apparent low bidder. ENGINEER will review shop drawings, diagrams, illustrations, catalog data, schedules and samples, equipment Operation and Maintenance (O&M) manuals, results of laboratory tests and inspections, equipment factory test certifications, equipment manufacturer certificates of proper installation, and other data that Contractors are required to submit for conformance with the design concept of the Project and compliance with the provisions of the Contract Documents. In addition, ENGINEER will receive and review items to be delivered by the Contractor(s) pursuant to the Contract Documents, including but not limited to maintenance and operating instructions, schedules, guarantees, warranties, bonds and certificates of inspection, tests and approvals. ENGINEER will provide written comments and recommendations concerning their completeness under the Contract Document.

The original CONTRACT, Work Task Order No. 1, and Work Task Order No. 2 had assumed a total of 299 shop drawings and O&M manuals were to be processed by ENGINEER with an effort of four (4) hours per submittal anticipated throughout the course of the construction phase of the project. The actual quantities of shop drawings and O&M manuals will exceed the assumed amount with a total of 365 shop drawings and O&M manuals now anticipated, this equates to 66 submittals beyond the 299 previously assumed for this task. The level of effort for the additional submittals remains at approximately four (4) hours per submittal.

4.3 - Interpretations, Clarifications and Change Orders

ENGINEER will issue interpretations and clarifications of Contract Documents during construction and evaluate requests for substitutions or deviations from the Contract Documents. ENGINEER will notify COUNTY of any such requested deviations or substitutions, and when reasonably necessary, provide COUNTY with a recommendation concerning same.

ENGINEER will negotiate with the Contractor the scope and cost of contract change orders using as a basis for such negotiations data or other information, emanating from the Contract Documents, including but not limited to the construction contract, general and special conditions, bid sheet, technical specifications, plans, shop drawings, material specifications, and proposed material and labor costs. ENGINEER will prepare, recommend and submit for COUNTY's approval such change orders or work change directives.

The original CONTRACT, Work Task Order No. 1, and Work Task Order No. 2 had assumed a total of 135 requests for information (RFIs) were to be addressed by ENGINEER with an effort of four (4) hours per RFI. The actual number of RFIs submitted by the Contractor exceed the assumed amount with a total of 150 RFIs now anticipated which is 15 beyond the 135 RFIs previously assumed. The level of effort for the additional RFI's remains at approximately four (4) hours per submittal.

The original CONTRACT, Work Task Order No. 1, and Work Task Order No. 2 had assumed a total of 31 change orders/work change directives were to be addressed by ENGINEER with an effort of eight (8) hours per submittal. The actual number of change orders/work change directives exceed the assumed amount with a total of 40 now anticipated which is nine (9) beyond the 31 change orders/work change directives previously assumed. The level of effort for the additional change orders/work change directives remains at approximately eight (8) hours per submittal.

Task 5 – Resident Project Representative

The ENGINEER will provide a RPR as described herein for the duration of the construction project to observe construction and monitor work. The RPR will be approved by the COUNTY.

5.1 – Resident Project Representative

ENGINEER will provide a RPR for field observation of the construction to help determine whether the general provisions of the Contract Documents are being fulfilled and to reasonably protect COUNTY against defects and deficiencies in the work of the Contractor. Compensation in Schedule A is based on providing additional RPR services for eight (8) hours per week over a 14 week duration and a total resident project representation level of effort based on 112 hours. In addition:

• ENGINEER, working principally through the Contractor's Superintendent, will assist the Contractor in the understanding the intent of the Contract Documents; and will assist COUNTY staff in serving as COUNTY's liaison with the Contractor.

- Based on available information, the ENGINEER will verify that tests, equipment and system startup are conducted in the presence of appropriate personnel and that the Contractor maintains adequate records thereof; and observe, record, and report appropriate details relative to the test procedures and startup to COUNTY and appropriate regulatory agencies. Based upon available information, ENGINEER will verify and certify to COUNTY that the constructed facilities properly operate and are in general conformance with the Contract Documents and specifications.
- ENGINEER will keep a diary or log book, recording date relative to questions of Work Directive Changes, Change Orders, or changed conditions, and observations in general
- ENGINEER will prepare a daily report for each day the RPR is on site, and submit said reports in electronic PDF format to the COUNTY on a weekly basis

ENGINEER will notify COUNTY and Contractor in writing when unsafe working conditions or safety violations are observed.

Compensation for the work tasks stated herein shall be in accordance with the following Schedule of Payments:

Task 3 – Construction Bid Services

Task 7 – Project Management

Completion Time:

13 months from receipt of Notice-to-Proceed for Tasks 1 through 3

Task 7 under the CONTRACT had an initial completion time of 36 months from receipt of Notice-to-Proceed. Completion time was extended in Amendment No. 1 to the CONTRACT for an additional 9 months and will be extended for an additional 12 months under Amendment No. 2 to the CONTRACT for a total CONTRACT completion time of 57 months from

receipt of Notice-to-Proceed.

Compensation for Phase 1:

The CONTRACT had an initial compensation of \$664,100.00 based on lump sum method of payment. Compensation was increased by \$24,628.74 for Task 7 under Work Task Order No. 2 for a revised CONTRACT total compensation amount of \$688,728.74.

Compensation was increased by \$152,282.61 in Work Task Order No. 1 to the CONTRACT and \$209,723.72 in Work Task Order No. 2 to the CONTRACT for a revised total compensation of \$1,026,106.33. Amendment No. 2 to the CONTRACT will increase the compensation an additional \$69,828.58 resulting in a CONTRACT total compensation amount of \$1,095,934.91.

- The Resident Project Representative (RPR) will review the Contractor's monthly applications for payment and accompanying data and recommend approval of payments due to the Contractor.
- RPR, working principally through the Contractor's Superintendent, will assist the Contractor in the understanding the intent of the Contract Documents; and will assist COUNTY staff in serving as COUNTY's liaison with the Contractor

- Based on available information, the RPR will verify that tests, equipment and system startup are conducted in the presence of appropriate personnel and that the Contractor maintains adequate records thereof; and observe, record, and report appropriate details relative to the test procedures and start-up to COUNTY and appropriate regulatory agencies. Based upon available information, RPR will verify and certify to COUNTY that the constructed facilities properly operate and are in general conformance with the contract documents and specifications
- RPR will keep a diary or log book, recording date relative to questions of Work Directive Changes, Change Orders, or changed conditions, and observations in general

COMPENSATION




