Summary: The CAC/HHS consists of 11 at-large members with at least one (1) member being a resident west of the 20 Mile Bend and at least one (1) member being a representative of the Palm Beach County League of Cities, per Resolution R2013-1563. The resolution requires that the executive committee of the CAC/HHS solicit and recommend member nominations for transmittal to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC). The BCC was notified by memo dated July 20, 2020 requesting nominations for appointments. The CAC/HHS at their regular committee meeting on July 9, 2020, recommended that all applications be forwarded to the BCC. All nominees meet all applicable guidelines and requirements outlined in the resolution. Ms. Gerwig is employed by AGA Engineering, which contracts with the County for services. Ms. Gerwig is also the Mayor with the Village of Wellington. The CAC/HHS provides no regulation, oversight, management, or policy setting recommendations regarding the subject contracts or transactions. Disclosure of this contractual relationship is being provided in accordance with the provisions of Section 2-443, of the Palm Beach County Code of Ethics. The diversity count for the eight (8) seats that are currently filled is: Caucasian: 6 (75%), and African-American: 2 (25%). The gender ratio (female:male) is 5:3. Ms. Cramer and Ms. Harvey are African-American. Ms. Gerwig and Ms. Valtin are Caucasian. Ex-officio membership consists of one (1) African-American male (25%), one (1) African-American female, (25%), one (1) Caucasian female (25%) and 1 Caucasian male (25%). Staff conducted targeted outreach in an effort to proffer candidates for appointments that maintain a diverse composition of the CAC/HHS. (Financially Assisted Agencies) Countywide (HH).

Background and Justification: The CAC/HHS was established in 1990. The committee is currently charged with assisting the BCC in the assessment of need, planning, implementation and evaluation of a system of care, as defined in the Health and Human Services Element of the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan. The committee has the responsibility to: 1) make recommendations on an annual basis during the Financially Assisted Agency funding process regarding services and funding priorities, outcomes and contract requirements; 2) create a forum for citizen participation; 3) make recommendations to the Planning Commission and BCC regarding amendments to the Health and Human Services Element of the Comprehensive Plan; 4) serve as a link to local and regional health and human service planning organization; and 5) make recommendation on the collection of data necessary to analyze the health and human service needs of people in Palm Beach County. Section 163.3181, Florida Statutes requires that the local planning agencies and local government units adopt procedures designed to provide effective public participation in the comprehensive planning process. The CAC/HHS has been designated to meet this requirement.

As a member of the leadership of the Florida Department of Children and Families, Elisa Cramer has developed, implemented and communicated initiatives focused on adoption, foster parent recruitment, and the safety of vulnerable children and adults. For Elisa, a career in public service is a natural progression of the civic-centered commitment and understanding of community concerns she demonstrated over 15 years as a reporter, editor and ultimately editorial writer and Opinion columnist with *The Palm Beach Post*.

As a member of the *Post's* editorial board, Elisa's columns and editorials explored a wide variety of issues, primarily concerned with health and social services. Her examinations of the welfare of children and women earned her the 2004 Maggie Award by Planned Parenthood of the Palm Beach and Treasure Coast Area and the 2005 Extra Mile Award by the Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County. Through an editorial series about Marissa Amora, a victim of child abuse who at the age of 2 was permanently brain-damaged, Elisa highlighted the vital and dynamic relationship between child welfare, community advocacy and state legislation. In June 2006, the Florida Society of Newspaper Editors awarded Elisa first place in editorial writing for her critical analysis of the child welfare issues identified in the Marissa Amora series.

Elisa joined the Department of Children and Families in 2009 as the Circuit 15 Director of Communications. In that role, and later as the Department's Community Development Administrator in Palm Beach County, Elisa worked closely with the Regional Managing Director and colleagues to evaluate the child welfare community-based care lead agency, assisting in performance management and troubleshooting concerns raised by the judiciary and other stakeholders.

In response to several child deaths due to unsafe sleep environments, Elisa led the implementation of The CRIBS Project ("Cribs 'R' for Infant/Baby Safety"). The public-private partnership trained parents on safe sleep environments, proper bedding techniques and how to avoid shaken baby syndrome. Upon completion of the training, parents who could not afford to purchase a crib were provided a portable crib and fitted sheet. To help implement the program, Elisa built a coalition of community stakeholders, coordinated with the national 'Cribs For Kids'® program based in Pennsylvania, promoted the program among child protective investigators, and advocated for support of the program in public forums. Eighteen months later, parents, babies, pediatricians, local hospitals, child welfare partners and philanthropists celebrated at a news conference the 100 babies who had thus far benefited from the program.

As part of the Department's efforts to contribute to a sense of normalcy for children in the dependency system, Elisa in June 2012 was intricately involved in planning and organizing the first-ever Palm Beach County Camp for Champions, a weekend summer camp for children in foster care.

Mindful of the Department's need to improve transparency for public credibility and employee morale, Elisa executed a proactive public information program, intent on providing a more comprehensive view of the Department. Elisa instituted "Demystifying DCF" to better inform community partners and members of the public about the Department's function. The workshops reached more than 1,000 attendees in Palm Beach County within months and were replicated in other DCF regions. Her multifaceted communications approach promoted information-sharing among DCF employees, community

partners and the public through responsiveness to media inquiries, creation of internal and external newsletters, issuance of news releases and coordination of news conferences on a variety of topics. She also managed the Department's response to tragedies involving children in DCF's care in Palm Beach County.

In August 2012, Elisa was invited to join the Department's statewide leadership team as the Director of Family and Community Services. In this role, Elisa was responsible for supervising the directors of the Office of Child Welfare, Adult Protective Services Program, Office on Homelessness, Domestic Violence and Independent Living Programs, and Child Care Regulation and Background Screening Programs.

Her unique competencies were fundamental as she advocated for the state's extension of foster care to age 21, representing the Department in meetings with more than two dozen state legislators, with numerous legislative and gubernatorial staff members, and during hearings of legislative committees. After the age extension was signed into Florida law, Elisa helped to lead the implementation of the new law, from convening a daylong statewide planning session for the Jan. 1, 2014 effective date to responding to multiple media requests for information; participating in a live webcast for foster parents, young adults and caregivers; preparing legislative presentations; and helping to develop and issue policy guidance.

As the Office of Child Welfare's Community Services Manager beginning in June 2014, Elisa supervised the directors of the Office of Child Care Regulation and Human Trafficking Prevention.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, REPEALING AND REPLACING RESOLUTION R-2001-0913; PROVIDING FOR THE CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMUTTEE ON HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

 Repeal and Replacement of Prior Resolution: Resolution R: 2001-0913 is hereby repealed and replaced with the inflowing:

Section 1. Creation of the Palm Reach County Citizens Advisory Committee on Health and Human Services. There is hereby established an Advisory Committee to be known as the "Palm Beach County Citizens Advisory Committee on Health and Human Services" herein referred to as the "Committee."

Section 2. Mission Statement. The mission of the Committee shall be to assist the Board of County Commissioners in the assessment of need, planning, implementation and evaluation of a System of Care, as defined in the Health and Human Services Element of the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan.

Section 3. Roles and Responsibilities. The Committee shall have the following roles and responsibilities:

A. To make recommendations on the collection of data necessary to analyze the health and human service needs of the people of Palin Brach County.

B. To create a forum for efficien perfluipation for all phases of the Health and Human Services Blament of the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan development and amendment process. Further, the Committee shall make recommendations to the Planning Commissions and the Heard of County Commissioners regarding amendments to the Health and Human Services Blament of the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan, and shall review the implementation status of the Health and Human Services Element of the Comprehensive Plan on an annual basis.

C. To create a known for citizen participation, the Committee shall specifically provide for consumer, minority and affected party input on an issue by issue basis to allow for those

affected to be involved in the Committee's activities.

D. To make recommendations on an annual basis during the Financially Assisted Agency funding process regarding service and funding priorities, outcomes and contract requirements.

- E. To serve as a link to local and regional health and human service planning organizations.

 Linkages may include ex-officio member appointments of the Committee, participation in other agency planning processes, and multi-agency task forces to resolve specific problems. Further, all agencies and staff within the auspices of the Board of County Commissioners shall provide data, information and such support as reasonably required, and shall otherwise work in cooperation with the Committee in pursuing the Board of County Commissioner's health and human service goals, objectives and policies. The purpose of such linkages is to facilitate the Committee in achieving its mission.
- F. Submit an annual manative report to the Agenda Coordinator. The form, substance and submittal dates for annual narrative reports are established by PPM-CW-O-060.
- G. To perform such other duffer as may be required from time to time assigned by the Board of County Commissioners.

Section 4. Membership. The Committee shall be comprised of eleven (11) members. The total membership of the Committee shall, at a minimum, represent the components of the Health and Human Services System of Cares public health, physical health, behavioral health, developmental services, children and family services, adult and eldicity services, education, recreation, workforce development, municipalities, business and economic development, planning/research & evaluation, manaportation, and housing. All members must reside in Palm Beach County at the time of appointment and while serving on the Board, and have knowledge of at least one component of the System of Care. Membership shall be representative of the racial, ethnic and geographic diversity of Palm Beach County. At least one member shall be a representative of the Palm Beach County League of Cities. At least one member shall be a representative of the Florida Department of Health in Palm Beach County.

A. <u>Appeintment</u>, Members shall be appointed at large by the Board of County Commissioners, and serve for staggered terms of three (3) years, with a limit of three (3) consecutive terms. Terms shall begin on October 1st, and end on September 30th.





Vacancies occurring during a term shall be filled for the mexpired portion of the term, and shall not count towards the member's term limits.

- B. Member Nominations. The nomination process shall begin ninety (90) days prior to the expiration of a member sterm, or immediately in the ovent of an unplanned vacancy. The Board of County Commissioners shall be notified and requested to provide nominations for committee appointment. The Palm Beach County Health Department and the Palm Beach County League of Cities will each be requested to subput a nomination. Numbers submitted by the Committee, the Palm Beach County League of Cities, the Palm Beach County Fredith Department and individual Commissioners will be transmitted to the Board of County Commissioners. An approved board appointment form, with attached resume, must be completed for all neutrinees prior to transmittal.
- C. Ex-officio Members. Ex-officio members may be appointed by a majority vote of the Committee, or as directed by the Board of County Commissioners, for the purpose of assisting the Committee in achieving its mission.
- D. Conflict of Interest Members shall be governed by the applicable provisions of Florida Code of Ellius for Public Offices and Employees and the applicable provisions of the Palm Brach County Code of Ethies.
- E. Compensation. Members shall receive no compensation for services, but may be entitled to travel reinfantsement incurred only for travel outside Palm Beach County necessary to fulfill board member responsibilities and only when sufficient funds have been budgeted and available as set forth in PPM CW-Q-038. Approval Authority for pre-authorized board member travel is designated to the County Administrator and Deputy County Administrator and Shall be in accordance with PPM CW-P-009. No other expenses will be reimbursable except documented long distance telephone calls to the linison County department.
- F. Attendance. Members shall be automittically removed for lack of attendance. Lack of attendance is defined as failure to attend three (3) consecutive meetings of a failure to attend more than one half of the meetings scheduled during a calendar year. Participation for less than three-fourths of a meeting shall be the same as a failure to attend a meeting. Members removed pursuant to this paragraph shall not continue to serve on the Committee and such removal shall create a vacancy.

Section 5. Officers. A chair and vice chair shall be elected by a majority vote of the Committee and shall serve for a term of one year; but not to exceed two consecutive terms in any one office. The duties of the chair shall be to:

- (A) Call Committee meetings and organize the agenda for the same;
- (B) Preside at committee receings;
- (C) Establish subcommittees, appoint subcommittee chairs, and charge subcommittee with specific tasks;
- (D) Serve as primary haison with staff and
- (E) Perform other functions as the committee may assign.

The vice-chair shall perform the duties of the chair in the chair's absence and such other duties as the chair may assign.

If a vacancy occurs in the affice of the chair, then the position shall be assumed by the vice-chair for the remainder of the term. Any remaining vacancies shall be filled through a majority vote of the Committee.

Any officer may be removed from office by a majority vote of the Committee whenever the best interest of the Committee and public would be served.

Section 6. Meetings. The Committee shall meet on a regular basis. A quorum must be present for the conduct of all negatar meetings. A majority of the members appointed shall constitute a quorum. The changes on may call a meeting of a meeting may be called upon the written request of three members.

- A. Subcommittees. The Committee will conduct its business through one (I) standing subcommittee, the Executive Committee, and od hoe sub-committees, work groups, and
 other appropriate forums as needed. The Executive Committee will consist of the
 Officers, the Immediate Past Chain, a representative whose residence is west of 20 mile
 bend and a representative of the Palmi Beach County League of Cities. The purpose of
 the Executive Committee is to review and evaluate matters arising between regular
 Committee meetings, and to solicit and recommend member normalisms for transmittal
 to the Board of County Commissioners. Ad hoe sub-committees shall be chaired by a
 Committee member.
- B. Conduct of Mactings. All meetings shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order and shall comply with the Sunshine Law. Reasonable public notice of all meetings shall be provided. All meetings of the Committee shall be open to the public at all times and minutes shall be taken at each meeting.

Section 7. Administration. Staff for the Communities shall be provided through the Department of Community Services.





Section 8. Uniform Policies and Procedures of Advisory Boards. The Committee shall be subject to the uniform policies and procedures established by the Board of County Commissioners for Advisory Boards as correculy set forth in Resolution No. 2013-0193, as may be further amended by action of the Board of County Commissioners.

Effective Date: The provisions of this resolution shall become effective upon approval of the Board of County Commissioners.
