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I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to:



- A) **Adopt** a resolution of the Board of County Commissioners (BCC), of Palm Beach County, Florida, accepting the grant award for FY19 Section 5310 from the State of Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), in the amount of \$852,658 for capital assistance under grants for the enhanced mobility of seniors and individuals with disabilities CFDA 20.513, as administered by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT);
- B) **Authorize** the County Administrator or Designee to sign the Notice of Grant Award FFY2019/YR44;
- C) **Approve** the purchase of (10) paratransit vehicles from Florida Transportation Systems, Inc. from FDOT Contract TRIPS-17-CA-FTS-C, and one (1) minivan from DMS Contract # 25100000-19-1 utilizing \$852,658 in FDOT funds, \$94,740 in required match for a cumulative purchase price of \$947,398 pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Notice of Grant Award FFY2019 Section 5310; and
- D) **Authorize** the County Administrator or her Designee to submit the Order Form for FDOT Contract TRIPS-17-CA-FTS-C and for DMS Contract # 25100000-19-1 to request purchase of the vehicles/equipment and/or expenditure of grant funds pursuant to a grant award.

Summary: Palm Tran will utilize this grant to purchase eleven (11) replacement paratransit vehicles at a total cost of \$947,398. The vehicles being replaced were purchased in 2015 with the Public Improvement Revenue Bond funds and have reached their end of life. This Notice of Grant Award, in the amount of \$852,658, for FY2019 Section 5310 funds requires a 10% match of \$94,740. The Notice of Award became effective upon FDOT Execution. Vehicles must be ordered by October 13, 2020. The required match is included in Palm Tran's FY2021 budget. Countywide (DR)

Background and Justification: Section 5310 funds must be used to transport seniors and/or individuals with disabilities. FDOT pays the vendor directly for 90% of the cost of the maximum award amount. Palm Beach County pays the remaining 10% directly to the vendor, in addition to any cost for additional equipment. Palm Tran submitted an application to FDOT, for the acquisition of replacement paratransit vehicles, in the amount of \$906,418. The BCC approved the submittal of this application on June 16, 2020 (R-2020-0705). Section 5310 Program provides funds to assist with meeting transportation needs of the elderly and individuals with disabilities.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS (BCC), OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, ACCEPTING THE GRANT AWARD FOR FY19 SECTION 5310 FROM THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (FDOT), IN THE AMOUNT OF \$852,658 FOR CAPITAL ASSISTANCE UNDER GRANTS FOR THE ENHANCED MOBILITY OF SENIORS AND INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES CFDA 20.513, AS ADMINISTERED BY THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (FDOT); ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, FDOT is authorized to provide funding for a mass transportation project; and

WHEREAS, the BCC has the authority to apply for and accept grants and make purchases and/or expend funds pursuant to grant awards made by FDOT as authorized by Chapter 341, Florida Statutes, and/or by the Federal Transit Administration Act of 1964, as amended;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

1. This resolution applies to the Federal Program under 49 U.S.C. Section 5310.
2. The assurances set forth in the attached Exhibits E, G, H and I are hereby affirmed.
3. The execution and submission of the Notification of Grant Award FFY 2019/YR44 to the Florida Department of Transportation is hereby approved.
4. The County Administrator or designee is authorized to sign and submit the Notice of Grant Award, reaffirm the County's assurances, request the purchase of vehicles/equipment by FDOT and expend grant funds and the County's match, pursuant to the grant award and approved budget.

5. The County Administrator or designee is further authorized to request the purchase of eleven (11) paratransit vehicles in accordance with the Palm Beach County Code and the County's rules and regulations, including those of its Purchasing Department.

6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

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EXHIBIT 2

Single Audit Requirements

The administration of resources awarded through the Department to the Agency by this Agreement may be subject to audits and/or monitoring by the Department. The following requirements do not limit the authority of the Department to conduct or arrange for the conduct of additional audits or evaluations of Federal awards or limit the authority of any State agency inspector general, the State of Florida Auditor General or any other State official. The Agency shall comply with all audit and audit reporting requirements as specified below.

- a. In addition to reviews of audits conducted in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, monitoring procedures may include but not be limited to on-site visits by Department staff and/or other procedures including, reviewing any required performance and financial reports, following up, ensuring corrective action, and issuing management decisions on weaknesses found through audits when those findings pertain to Federal awards provided through the Department by this Agreement. By entering into this Agreement, the Agency agrees to comply and cooperate fully with any monitoring procedures/processes deemed appropriate by the Department. The Agency further agrees to comply and cooperate with any inspections, reviews, investigations or audits deemed necessary by the Department, State of Florida Chief Financial Officer (CFO) or State of Florida Auditor General.
- b. The Agency, a non-Federal entity as defined by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, as a subrecipient of a Federal award awarded by the Department through this Agreement is subject to the following requirements:
 - i. In the event the Agency expends a total amount of Federal awards equal to or in excess of the threshold established by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, the Agency must have a Federal single or program-specific audit for such fiscal year conducted in accordance with the provisions of 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements. **Exhibit 1** to this Agreement provides the required Federal award identification information needed by the Agency to further comply with the requirements of 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements. In determining Federal awards expended in a fiscal year, the Agency must consider all sources of Federal awards based on when the activity related to the Federal award occurs, including the Federal award provided through the Department by this Agreement. The determination of amounts of Federal awards expended should be in accordance with the guidelines established by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements. An audit conducted by the State of Florida



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Auditor General in accordance with the provisions of 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, will meet the requirements of this part.

- ii. In connection with the audit requirements, the Agency shall fulfill the requirements relative to the auditee responsibilities as provided in 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements.
- iii. In the event the Agency expends less than the threshold established by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, in Federal awards, the Agency is exempt from Federal audit requirements for that fiscal year. However, the Agency must provide a single audit exemption statement to the Department at FDOTSingleAudit@dot.state.fl.us no later than nine months after the end of the Agency's audit period for each applicable audit year. In the event the Agency expends less than the threshold established by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, in Federal awards in a fiscal year and elects to have an audit conducted in accordance with the provisions of 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, the cost of the audit must be paid from non-Federal resources (i.e., the cost of such an audit must be paid from the Agency's resources obtained from other than Federal entities).
- iv. The Agency must electronically submit to the Federal Audit Clearinghouse (FAC) at <https://harvester.census.gov/facweb/> the audit reporting package as required by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, within the earlier of 30 calendar days after receipt of the auditor's report(s) or nine months after the end of the audit period. The FAC is the repository of record for audits required by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, and this Agreement. However, the Department requires a copy of the audit reporting package also be submitted to FDOTSingleAudit@dot.state.fl.us within the earlier of 30 calendar days after receipt of the auditor's report(s) or nine months after the end of the audit period as required by 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements.
- v. Within six months of acceptance of the audit report by the FAC, the Department will review the Agency's audit reporting package, including corrective action plans and management letters, to the extent necessary to determine whether timely and appropriate action on all deficiencies has been taken pertaining to the Federal award provided through the Department by this Agreement. If the Agency fails to have an audit conducted in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F – Audit Requirements, the Department may impose additional conditions to remedy noncompliance. If the Department determines that noncompliance cannot be



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remedied by imposing additional conditions, the Department may take appropriate actions to enforce compliance, which actions may include but not be limited to the following:

1. Temporarily withhold cash payments pending correction of the deficiency by the Agency or more severe enforcement action by the Department;
 2. Disallow (deny both use of funds and any applicable matching credit for) all or part of the cost of the activity or action not in compliance;
 3. Wholly or partly suspend or terminate the Federal award;
 4. Initiate suspension or debarment proceedings as authorized under 2 C.F.R. Part 180 and Federal awarding agency regulations (or in the case of the Department, recommend such a proceeding be initiated by the Federal awarding agency);
 5. Withhold further Federal awards for the Project or program;
 6. Take other remedies that may be legally available.
- vi. As a condition of receiving this Federal award, the Agency shall permit the Department, or its designee, the CFO or State of Florida Auditor General access to the Agency's records including financial statements, the independent auditor's working papers and project records as necessary. Records related to unresolved audit findings, appeals or litigation shall be retained until the action is complete or the dispute is resolved.

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Auditor General upon request for a period of five years from the date the audit report is issued unless extended in writing by the Department.



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Exhibit 3: Procurement Process Overview

This information is intended to provide guidance on the processes for procurements when using state and federal dollars. Procurements should be in accordance with Chapter 287, Florida Statutes (F.S.), Chapter 60A, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Best Practices Procurement Manual. Additionally, geographic preferences are prohibited when procurements involve federal funds [*reference: 49 CFR 18.36 (c)(1)(2) and FTA C 4220.1F, Ch. VI, Section 2.a(4)(g)*].

Third Party Contracts refer to a recipient's contract with a vendor or contractor, including procurement by purchase order or purchase by credit card, which is financed with Federal assistance awarded by FTA.

An agency should submit their procurement request to the District Representative for approval prior to completing the purchase. To complete the procurement request, the agency should follow these steps:

1. Determine the funding source (i.e. – federal, state, or local funds)
2. Determine type of procurement being requested (Examples are located in the Procurement Guidance for Transit Agencies Handbook)
 - Professional Services/Architectural Engineering Services
 - Operations/Management/Sub-recipients
 - Rolling Stock
 - Construction
 - Materials and Supplies
3. Determine level of procurement method
 - Micro Purchase–Procurements less than \$2,500
 - Small Purchases–Procurements greater than \$2,500 but less than \$35,000
 - Competitive Procurements–Procurements greater than \$35,000
 - Other methods listed in the Procurement Guidance for Transit Agencies Manual
4. Ensure that all potential vendors/contractors will accept the applicable federal clauses that relate to the procurement.
5. Complete the sub-recipient Procurement Checklist



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6. Complete the appropriate third-party checklist from the Procurement Guidance for Transit Agencies Handbook. The checklist should notate where the applicable clause can be found in the supporting documentation.

For procurements that are categorized as a "Small Purchase", a sample Vendor Small Purchase letter is in the Procurement Guidance for Transit Agencies Handbook. Agencies may utilize this letter as a template when third party agreements/contracts are necessary. This will ensure that the third party (vendor or contractor) accepts the applicable federal clauses.
