I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: a budget transfer of \$5,000,000 within the CARES Act Relief Fund from Operating Reserves to General Government Expenses.

Summary: Pursuant to the CARES Act Relief Fund (CRF) program, the County received an automatic payment of \$261,174,823 on April 23, 2020. The County has until December 30, 2020 to expend funds. These funds must only be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus.

The attached budget transfer will recognize the change in fiscal strategy. These funds will be transferred to General Government Expenses to be used for Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) and other COVID-19 Expenses. Countywide (DB).

Background and Policy Issues: The County received our allocation of the CARES Act Relief funds from the federal government to offset the impact of COVID-19 to our community. The CARES Act provides for the immediate distribution of \$261,174,823.
