## I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

**Motion and Title:** Staff recommends motion to authorize: the County Administrator or designee to administratively process budget transfers within the CARES Act Relief Fund to properly account for expenses within the approved fiscal categories.

**Summary:** Pursuant to the CARES Act Relief Fund program, the County received an automatic payment of \$261,174,823 on April 23, 2020. The County has until December 30, 2020 to expend funds. These funds must only be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus. This will allow the County to spend all funds that are allocated within the CARES Act Relief Fund including appropriation to Palm Beach County Municipalities and the School District of Palm Beach County. Countywide (DB).

**Background and Policy Issues:** The County received our allocation of the CARES Act Relief funds from the federal government to offset the impact of COVID-19 to our community. The CARES Act provides for the immediate distribution of \$261,174,823.
