Palm Beach County Annual Report



October 1, 2019 - September 30, 2020

The Florida Forest Service (FFS) maintains ten certified wildland firefighter positions and seven fire fighting units in Palm Beach County. These positions consist of one Forest Area Supervisor, two Senior Forest Rangers and seven Forest Rangers.

During the 2019/2020 fiscal year, the FFS suppressed 12 wildfires burning a total of 1749.2 acres of forest and wildlands throughout Palm Beach County.

The FFS continues aggressive fire reduction efforts through mechanical removal of hazardous fuels, prescribed burning, and fire awareness programs. Prescribed burning is a joint effort between the FFS and Palm Beach County Department of Environmental Resources Management, Palm Beach County Parks & Recreation Department, and Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. The sites where the prescribed burns and mechanical mitigation occurred were identified as potentially dangerous wildfire areas due to the amount of ground fuel at these locations. By mechanically mitigating and burning these sites under a controlled environment, the hazard of wildfires was greatly reduced in these areas.

The Florida Forest Service and the Palm Beach County Fire Rescue are jointly working to reduce the wildfire risk in our wildland urban interface communities.

The community of Caloosa has been certified as a Fire Wise Community. This is the first community in Palm Beach County to achieve this national recognition.

The importance of fire prevention is stressed through several FFS programs including; Smokey Bear programs, career days, parades and the South Florida Fair. During this period,19 programs were conducted reaching nearly 32,000 people.

The FFS continues to offer training sessions in forestry topics to different cooperative agencies and departments. The FFS also continues to monitor open burning compliance situations, patrol fire sensitive areas and issues burning authorizations throughout Palm Beach County. The FFS has streamlined the way burn authorizations are approved; customers are no longer required to contact the local County Fire Rescue station. Customers seeking a burn authorization in Palm Beach County must be inspected and must contact the FFS before an open burn is permitted. Each day the FFS sends the information about permitted burns to the Palm Beach County Fire Rescue liaison, who can disseminate as the information as necessary.

The FFS in conjunction with the Florida Sugar Cane League and the Palm Beach County Public Health Unit also implements an environmentally sensitive burning program designed specifically for the sugar cane fields. This program has significantly reduced the number of smoke complaints due to establishing restrictions to minimize the adverse impact of smoke to the residents, designating burning zones, and improving weather and smoke forecasting models developed by FFS. Our efforts include daily patrols to monitor the quality of the pre-harvest sugar cane burns. The daily patrols are vital to the area because they will ensure that the burns will have minimal smoke impact on the populated areas of our county and on our neighboring counties.

The Everglades District which covers Palm Beach, Broward, Miami Dade and Monroe counties has a very proactive aerial wildfire detection program which utilizes the use of a fixed winged aircraft. The fixed wing pilot's responsibilities are detection and suppression support from the air. Detection is carried out by flying established low altitude routes and patterns that best cover the assigned area for the purpose of spotting smoke columns and locating fires. Suppression support is fire reconnaissance, direction, and identification of possible hazards that could affect crew safety and mission completion.

As we prepare for our next fire season, we want to recognize the cooperation and the support given to the FFS by Palm Beach County Fire Rescue. Mutual aid is essential to our efforts in suppressing wildfires throughout the county. I would like to commend all the fire fighters in our county for keeping the citizens of Palm Beach County out of harm's way. With Palm Beach County Fire Rescue and the FFS working together, we were able to control our fires and keep our county a safe and pleasant place for all.
