


Deaths in US Last 30 Days









DOH-Palm Beach Vaccination Efforts

- Continue operations at Mid-County Senior Center at 3680 Lake Worth Road in Lake Worth providing both Moderna and Pfizer vaccines to the public with appointments and walk-ins to assure there is still government sites available.
- Enhanced services at our CL Brumback Health Center in Belle Glade to include vaccinations and testing with both PCR (6/1 102) and Rapid Tests (6/4 11).
- As vaccination numbers have decreased, staff are able to deploy mobile units to business, community organizations and other outreach efforts.
- Our biggest distribution of vaccines has been helping community partners who need vaccine to vaccinate their own patients or staff.
- Engaged a State sponsored Strike Team through June to provide Homebound vaccines at <u>MyMobileVax.com.</u>
- Also coordinating with Feeding South Florida working with Strike Teams to vaccinate at churches and community centers throughout the county.
- Finally, working closely with the County Administration to bring Monoclonal Antibody services
 to Palm Beach County for those who are uninsured or underinsured.





May 2 - June 2, 2021






COVID-19 daily lab positivity

May 20 - June 2, 2021






Daily lab positivity




COVID-19 positive total hospital census

May 20 - June 2, 2021




COVID hospitalizations since October 2020




COVID-19 deaths

April 16 - May 16, 2021






COVID positive deaths 2021




COVID-19 positive ICU cases


COVID positive ICU cases
