I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: Work Order No. 21-035 to the annual minor construction services contract with Andrea Construction, Inc. (Contractor) (R2020-0143) in the amount of \$479,564 for the Mounts Botanical Garden – Gift Shop Renovation project for a period of 200 calendar days from permit issuance.


Summary: The project consists of renovating approximately 1,500 square feet of the existing gift shop building, which includes relocating the existing service counter; removing the existing north side window and the existing office; and reconfiguring the existing storage areas in order to expand the interior of the gift shop. Additionally, the work includes renovations to the existing restrooms, providing site control turnstiles, electrical service improvement, updating the fire alarm system, and installing fencing and gates to the exterior of the facility for controlled access. The existing building is more than 20 years old with an outdated layout and appearance. The new design will modernize the space, improve the appearance of the facility, and create a more controlled public entrance from, and exit to, the garden areas. The Contractor shall substantially complete the project within 200 calendar days of permit issuance. Liquidated damages are \$164 per day for failure to achieve certification of substantial completion within the contract time or approved extension thereof. This project was competitively advertised and new contractors were invited to bid by submitting prequalification documents prior to the submission of the bid response. This work order was solicited pursuant to the annual minor construction contract and the requirements of the Equal Business Opportunity (EBO) Ordinance. The annual contract was presented to the Goal Setting Committee on August 21, 2019. The Committee applied the following three Affirmative Procurement Initiatives (API): 1) sheltered market for projects under \$100,000; or 2) a small business enterprise (SBE) contractor will be given a price preference if its bid is within 10% of the lowest non-small business bid on a single trade project over \$100,000; or 3) a mandatory 25% SBE subcontracting goal for a multi-trade project over \$100,000. The Contractor is a certified SBE and submitted 62.34% SBE participation on this work order. The overall SBE participation on the annual minor construction contract is 86.25%. The Contractor is a Palm Beach County business. Funding for this project is from the Capital Outlay fund. **(Capital Improvements Division) District 7 (LDC)**

Background and Justification: This project was openly, competitively advertised and procured. Bids for this project were opened on May 27, 2021 and the Contractor submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid.





THIS WORK ORDER is made as of _____ by and between Palm Beach County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as “Owner”, and Andrea Construction, Inc., a Florida corporation, hereinafter referred to as “Contractor”.

WHEREAS, the Owner and Contractor acknowledge and agree that the Contract between Owner and Contractor dated 2/11/2020 (R2020-0143) (“Contract”) is in full force and effect and that this Work Order incorporates all the terms and conditions of the Contract as may be supplemented and amended by this Work Order;

NOW THEREFORE, in exchange for the mutual covenants and promises set forth herein and the sums of money agreed to be paid by the Owner to the Contractor, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Recitals.** The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. Total Bid Amount.** Pursuant to Section 6.3 of the Instructions to Bidders of the Annual Contract for Minor Construction between Owner and Contractor, the Contractor was the lowest, responsive, responsible Bidder in the amount of **\$479,564.00** for the construction costs of renovation of the Gift Shop as set forth on the **Bid Form** attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- 3. Schedule of Time for Completion.** The time of completion for this Work Order will be as follows: The Contractor shall substantially complete the project within **200** calendar days of permit issuance. Liquidated Damages are \$164/day for failure to achieve certification of substantial completion within the contract time or approved extension thereof.
- 4. APIs.** The APIs applicable to this Contract are attached hereto.
- 5. EBO Participation to Date.** To date Contractor has achieved 74.68% SBE subcontracting participation on this Contract. Contractor will provide 62.34% on this Work Order.

7. Annual Contract Modifications and Additions. The following provisions of the Annual Contract are modified as follows:

Section 5.2 of the “Instructions to Bidders” of the Contract is modified to include the following new section:

5.2.5 Failure to Provide the Required Documents after Notification of Award. *If after Notification of award from the County, the successful Bidder does not provide within 14 Days of Notification the signed Work Order, the Public Construction Bond and Guarantee (when required), and the required certificates of insurance, the County may: 1. Call in the bid security when provided; 2. Cancel the notification of recommended award and award the project to the next responsive, responsible low bidder; 3. Terminate this Annual Contract for cause; 4. Suspend or debar the Bidder from bidding on future projects for a period of two (2) years, in accordance with the Palm Beach County Purchasing Ordinance; and/or 5. Pursue any and all remedies available against the Bidder for damages resulting from its failure to enter into a Work Order and provide all required documents within 14 Days after notification.*

The Insurance Coverage & Limit Table of General Condition 31.15 to the Contract is amended and modified as follows:

The following General Condition is added to the General Conditions:

GC 83 E-VERIFY - EMPLOYMENT ELIGIBILITY

83.1 Contractor warrants and represents that it is in compliance with section 448.095, Florida Statutes, as may be amended, and that it: (1) is registered with the E-Verify System (E-Verify.gov), and beginning January 1, 2021, uses the E-Verify System to electronically verify the employment eligibility of all newly hired workers; and (2) has verified that all of the Contractor’s subcontractors performing any duties and obligations under this Contract are registered with the E-Verify System and beginning January 1, 2021, use the E-Verify System to electronically verify the employment eligibility of all newly hired workers.

83.2 Contractor shall obtain from each of its subcontractors an affidavit stating that the subcontractor does not employ, contract with, or subcontract with an Unauthorized Alien, as that term is defined in section 448.095(1)(k), Florida Statutes, as may be amended. Contractor shall maintain a copy of any such affidavit from a subcontractor for, at a minimum, the duration of the subcontract and any extension thereof. This provision shall not supersede any provision of this Contract which requires a longer retention period.

83.3 *Owner shall terminate this Contract if it has a good faith belief that Contractor has knowingly violated Section 448.09(1), Florida Statutes as may be amended.*

83.3.1 *If Owner has a good faith belief that Contractor's subcontractor has knowingly violated Section 448.09(1), Florida Statutes, as may be amended, Owner shall notify Contractor to terminate its contract with the subcontractor and Contractor shall immediately terminate its contract with the subcontractor.*

83.4 *If Owner terminates this Contract pursuant to the above, Contractor shall be barred from being awarded a future contract by Owner for a period of one (1) year from the date on which this Contract was terminated. In the event of such contract termination, Contractor shall also be liable for any additional costs incurred by Owner as a result of the termination.*

8. Except as modified herein, the Contract remains in full force and effect. All capitalized terms herein shall have the same meaning as set forth in the Contract.
