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Background and Justification: On May 1, 2007, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) established the Homeless Advisory Board to develop a Ten-Year Plan to end Homelessness in Palm Beach County (Ten-Year Plan). The BCC formally adopted the Ten-Year Plan in September 2008. Development of a Homeless Resource Center is one of the Action Steps of the Ten-Year Plan. On March 20, 2012, the BCC approved the Senator Philip D. Lewis Center concept and funding allocation for its operation. Homeless individuals and families received a diverse offering of high quality services from three (3) community agencies, assisting clients in ending their homelessness. Services are available to Palm Beach County's homeless adults and families on a 24-hour basis, 365 days a year. Funded organizations are monitored by Community Services Department to maintain programmatic and fiscal accountability. Contracts include the following safeguards to protect the County: insurance coverage is mandatory, funds are paid on a unit cost basis, and funds cannot be used to initiate or pursue litigations against the County.
