

Summary: On July 7, 2020, the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) accepted a Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) grant award in the amount of \$699,965 for the FY19 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program (R-2020-0800). On May 4, 2021, the BOCC approved an extension through September 30, 2021 (R-2021-0603). This agenda item extends the grant period through December 31, 2021. The UASI is a federally-funded homeland security grant program, pass-through the State of Florida to the City of Miami, as the UASI's fiscal agent. The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number is 97.067 and the contract number is R0075. There is **no match requirement** associated with this award. Countywide (LDC).

Background and Justification: The Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) is intended to create a sustainable national model program to enhance security and overall preparedness to prevent, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism. 




Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: A) Accept on behalf of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office a Memorandum of Agreement with the City of Miami for a FY19 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant in the amount of \$699,965 for the period of May 28, 2020 through June 30, 2021, and B) Approve a budget amendment of \$699,965 in the Sheriff's Grant Fund.

Summary: On April 6, 2020, the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) received a grant award in the amount of \$699,965 for the FY19 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program. The UASI is a federally-funded homeland security grant program, pass-through the State of Florida to the City of Miami, as the UASI's fiscal agent. The funds will be used for various domestic security initiatives within the County and the Southeast Florida Region 7, including intelligence operations, training and exercises, and equipment for our specialty teams. There is no match requirement associated with this award. Countywide (LDC).
