| Background and Justification : The Palm Beach County Drowning Prevention Coalition program was relocated to Palm Beach County Fire-Rescue on October 1, 2000. The relocation gave the Drowning Prevention Coalition office space within Palm Beach County Fire Rescue. The funding sources for this program in FY 2022 include a transfer from the County's General Fund in the amount of \$194,792, which is accounted for in the adopted FY 2022 budget, a balance brought forward of \$2,997, and the agreement with the Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County in the amount of \$100,000. The Children's Services Council's contribution will defray some costs associated with the Drowning Prevention Coalition program. | | | | | | | |

Operating costs for FY 2023 through FY 2026 are calculated using a 3% increase assumption. External revenues received from the CSC are committed on an annual basis by their Board; however, their minimum annual contribution over the past several years has been \$50,000. MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement, entered into as of this 1st day of September, 2021 by and between the CHILDREN'S SERVICES COUNCIL OF PALM BEACH COUNTY (hereinafter referred to as "CSC"), a political subdivision of the State of Florida and PALM BEACH COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, by and through its Board of County Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "PBCBCC"), effective October 1, 20201 ("Effective Date") to September 30, 2022.

CSC has agreed to fund up to \$100,000 to PBCBCC for the Drowning Prevention Coalition of Palm Beach County for the period October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022.

CSC, as one of the funders of Drowning Prevention Coalition of Palm Beach County, agrees to transfer funds to PBCBCC in accordance with the following schedule and terms:

- 1. Transfers from CSC to the PBCBCC for expenditures made prior to September 30, 2022 will be made in accordance with the following procedures:
 - a) \$50,000 will be transferred within 30 days of receipt of a written request for funds from CSC by the PBCBCC to be specifically set aside to fund swim lessons for children between the ages of 2 and 12.
 - b) \$50,000 to be allocated for Drowning Prevention Coalition of Palm Beach County program expenses, which will be combined with funding from the PBCBCC, will be transferred within 30 days of receipt of a written request for funds from CSC by the PBCBCC specifying the amount requested based upon the attached Exhibit "A", Financial Reporting on Expenditures & Request for Reimbursement form.
 - c) The request will be submitted to CSC in sufficient time as to allow 30 days for processing.
- 2. The PBCBCC shall submit to the CSC quarterly reports of effectiveness and include statistics and data on the number of persons served.
- 3. No transfers will be made by CSC pursuant to this Memorandum of Agreement for expenditures made after September 30, 2022, and the PBCBCC agrees to (1) refund any of CSC's money advanced but not expended by September 30, 2022 and (2) submit an executed Financial Reconciliation Statement (Attached Exhibit "B") within 45 days of September 30, 2022.
- 4. Disallowable Expenditures: CSC reserves the right to disallow any expenditure that is considered inappropriate for the program or initiative it funds even if it falls within the expenditure limitations. CSC generally will not fund or reimburse the following:
 - a) The purchase of real property and/or renovations (permanent improvements to the property or site preparations).
 - b) Medical equipment, services or treatment (unless specifically referenced in the contract).
 - c) Mortgage payments, interest payments, financing agreements or long-term vehicle leases.
 - d) Staff entertainment expenses.
 - e) Alcoholic beverages.

- f) Late fees or financing fees (for example: credit card late fees, late fees from lease agreements or on a standard bill).
- g) Florida state sales tax on purchases made.
- h) Expenses that are incurred outside of the budget period being billed for reimbursement.
- i) Bonuses to staff employed in its funded programs or initiatives
- j) Accrued vacation and sick time payouts <u>except</u> upon separation from employment as provided for in the personnel policies and procedures of the funded agency.

CSC reserves the right to disallow or seek repayment of any program-inappropriate expenditure including without limitation those addressed in the list above.

- 5. A final financial compilation report, accompanied by a Financial Reconciliation Statement (**Exhibit** "B") accounting for all funds expended will be provided to CSC no later than November 15, 2022.
- 6. The PBCBCC agrees to comply with the following requirements:
 - a) To maintain its financial books, records and documents in accordance with generally accepted accounting procedures and practices, so that they sufficiently and properly reflect all expenditures of funds provided by the CSC under this Agreement.
 - b) To ensure that these records are available for inspection, review or audit by persons duly authorized by the CSC to make such inspection, review or audit.
 - c) To retain all financial records, supporting documents, statistical records and any other documents pertinent to the Agreement for a period of six (6) years following termination of the Agreement or, if an audit has been initiated and audit findings have not been resolved, the records shall be retained until resolution of all such audit findings.
 - d) To permit persons duly authorized by the CSC to have full access to and the right to examine:
 - I. Any of the materials described in section 6.a. d. during the term of this Agreement; and
 - II. The premises where the program funded by the CSC is conducted, for purposes of monitoring said program.
- 7. The parties recognize that the COVID-19 pandemic may impact normal business operations, program capacity and child outcomes for an undetermined period. CSC and PBCBCC agree to partner in the development and continuous monitoring of protocols and strategies to protect the health and safety of PBCBCC staff and the children and families receiving CSC funded services.

PBCBCC also agrees to:

- a) Follow protocols recommended by public health and other government officials;
- b) Establish interim emergency processes as needed to adapt to the evolving conditions caused by COVID-19;
- c) Leverage technology capacities to minimize the disruption on work and the impact on children and families;
- d) Partner with CSC in the development of strategies to optimize resources and address programmatic challenges caused by COVID-19.
- e) Inform CSC of any conditions or events that may adversely alter PBCBCC's operations and its ability to meet any requirements under this Agreement. Notice to the CSC shall be submitted within 5 business days of the condition or event occurring. Notice to CSC shall not be construed to be a modification of the terms of the Agreement.

> f) Program Officers will work with providers, on a case-by case basis, to address situations in which the program identifies that a performance measure or measures will not be met, specifically related to a change in service delivery due to COVID-19 adaptations or restrictions.

Availability of required trainings may be impacted by COVID-19. CSC will make information available about training availability and adjust the training requirements for PBCBCC as needed.

- 8. Pursuant to Section 448.095 F.S. Provider and any subcontractors used to carry out the duties and responsibilities in this contract, shall register with and use the E-Verify system (E-Verify.gov) to verify the work authorization for newly hired employees. If applicable, Provider must also obtain and retain an affidavit from a subcontractor stating that the subcontractor does not employ, contract with or subcontract with anyone who is not duly authorized to work in the United States.
- 9. The parties to this Agreement are aware that the Inspector General of Palm Beach County has the authority to investigate and review matters relating to the negotiation and performance of this Agreement, and in furtherance thereof may demand and obtain all records and documents in possession of the CSC's contractors and subcontractors and lower tier subcontractors, as well as, any other person or entity doing business with the CSC or receiving CSC funds. The PBCBCC understands and agrees that in addition to all other remedies and consequences provided by law, the failure of the CSC's contractors and subcontractors and lower tier subcontractors, as well as, any other person or entity doing business with the CSC or receiving CSC funds to fully cooperate with the Inspector General when requested may be deemed by the CSC to be a material breach of this Agreement justifying its termination.
- 10. No provision of this Contract is intended to, or shall be construed to, create any third party beneficiary or to provide any rights to any person or entity not a party to this Contract, including but not limited to any citizen or employees of the PBCBCC and/or CSC.
