Palm Tran is embarking on a systemwide upgrade of the bus shelters and related amenities provided at their bus stops. Palm Tran has 2,941 bus stops of which 330 currently have bus shelters, this project is identifying and targeting every bus stop that can accommodate a shelter within the existing Right of Way. At the same time, stops that cannot accommodate a shelter can be outfitted with solar lighting fixtures that can be added to the regular Bus Stop sign, Digital Displays and USB ports for charging phones.

This multi-year effort is an investment in Palm Tran's most important resource – its passengers and their quality of life. By the time these funds become available, the project will be at its implementation phase. The solicitation process is in place for bus shelters and bus stop amenities. Once the bus shelters and bus stop amenities have been procured, a second, subsequent RFP for design and engineering of selected bus stops will move the Bus Stop Improvement Program into the design phase. Once plans are prepared for the selected bus stop locations, a third RFP for construction and installation can be issued for contractors to put the bus shelters and bus stop amenities in the ground.

Palm Tran on-board surveys, and review of the customer complaints have identified transit amenities as one of the priorities for Palm Tran customers.

Projects impacting single family residential lots will require additional documentation of public support. Palm Beach County has in place a contract for the maintenance of all bus stops. The current contract has language that allows for the addition of new bus shelters and the required maintenance. The contract that will be issued for the purchase of the pre-fabricated shelters and amenities includes the provision of spare parts. Palm Tran will the contract administrator and Palm Tran holds responsibility for maintenance of the new transit amenities.

COST ESTIMATE

The total construction amount of Local Initiatives Program funds requested per projects (infrastructure) must be in excess of \$250,000 with a maximum project amount of \$5,000,000.

Local Initiatives Program funds will be used to fund Construction, Construction Engineering and Inspection Activities (CEI) and FDOT in-house support activities. The applicant may also request that Local Initiative Program funds be used for project Design, Environmental Services, and Post Design Services.

Public transportation encourages energy conservation, as the average number of passengers on a transit vehicle (19 Riders per Revenue hour) far exceeds that of a private automobile (1.6). Even as a single transit vehicle consumes more energy than a private vehicle, the average amount of energy utilized per passenger is far less. The replacement of four (4) diesel vehicles with electric buses, will eliminate 6,760 tons of CO2, 40 tons of nitrogen oxides, 1,400 pounds of diesel particulate matter and is equivalent to removing 108 cars of the road.

The primary purpose is to deploy the cleanest U.S.-made transit buses that have been proven in testing and demonstrations but are not yet widely deployed in transit fleets. Palm Tran will replace diesel buses with electric buses, install charging stations, and train mechanics and operators on the new technology.

Palm Tran conducted social media surveys on the topic of electric vehicles with great response from the pulbic, in 2019 the Board of County Commissioners approved the project, and the ongoing maintenance and operations expenses associated with the project.

The Electric Bus Transition Initiative Project will be implemented by Palm Tran's experienced project managementteam and technical experts in transit operations, with oversight and funding by the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners.
