Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to receive and file: Amendment No.0003 to the Unified Homeless Grant Contract No. #IP004 (R2021-0781) with the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF), for the period July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2022, to revise the Emergency Solutions Grant — Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act (ESG-CV2) funds Fiscal Year Payment Tables for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2020 - 2021 and SFY 2021 - 2022.

**Summary:** The Palm Beach County Division of Human Services (DHS) grant contract with DCF was amended to update the ESG-CV funds fiscal year payment tables. The shift in funding allows Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners the opportunity to fully expend the ESG-CV award amounts that were not spent during SFY 2020 - 2021. On June 15, 2021, the Board of County Commissioners authorized the County Administrator, or designee, to execute documents for this purpose. In accordance with County PPM CW-O-051, all delegated contracts, agreements and grants must be submitted by initiating department as a receive and file. The grant contract CSFA No. is 60.021. **No County match is required.** (Human Services) Countywide (HH)

**Background and Justification:** DHS serves as the Lead Entity for the Palm Beach County Homeless Continuum of Care (CoC). The CoC is the planning and evaluation body for the homeless service delivery system in Palm Beach County and is a requirement of the Housing and Urban Development Agency (HUD). The DCF Office on Homelessness works in conjunction with HUD to provide funding opportunities to assist persons who are homeless or are at risk of homelessness.

Homeless Grant Budget Amendment #0003

On June 15, 2021 (Agenda Item 3E-2), the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) granted signature authority to the County Administrator, or designee, to implement the Emergency Solutions Grant Program - CARES Act (ESG-CV2), and to approve associated contracts, agreements and amendments. In accordance with this authority, the Community Services Department (CSD) respectfully requests your approval and signature on the IP004 Department of Children and Families (DCF) Unified Grant Budget Amendment #0003 (CFSA 60.021).

DCF received \$65,511,297 in ESG-CV2 funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The ESG-CV2 funding is used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the pandemic among individuals and families who are homeless or receiving homeless assistance. The funding is also being used to support additional assistance and prevention services for the homeless to help mitigate the impacts created by the pandemic. On April 23, 2021, DCF notified Palm Beach County of ESG-CV2 additional funding to continue responding to the needs of the homeless during the pandemic. The Palm Beach County Division of Human Services (DHS) contract with DCF was amended to reflect an increase in ESG-CV2 funding in the amount of \$1,052.023. which became effective on May 1, 2021.

This amendmen

will also update the ESG-CV funds Fiscal Year Payment Tables for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2020/2021 and SFY 2021/2022. The shift of funding will allow Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners the opportunity to fully expend the ESG-CV award amounts that were not spent during SFY 2020/2021. The effective date of this amendment is February 1, 2022. No County match is required.

DHS serves as the Lead Entity for the Palm Beach County Homeless Continuum of Care (CoC). The CoC is the planning and evaluation body for homeless services. DHS will receive funds as the lead entity for the CoC pursuant to 420.624 (6), F.S. To ensure the continuation of homeless prevention services, DCF requires the signed amendment as soon as possible. The walkthrough process is being utilized because there is not sufficient time to submit this item through the BCC agenda process. Staff will submit this item at the next available BCC meeting.

### I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to:

**A) approve** the signature of the Mayor on Amendment No.0002 to Grant Contract #IP004 with the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF) Unified Homeless Grant (CFSA 60.021), for the period July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2022, to increase funding by \$1,052,023 for a new total amount not-to-exceed \$2,963,451.55;

- **B) approve** a budget amendment of \$1,052,023 in the General Fund, Human Services Division, to align the budget to the actual grant;
- C) approve Amendment No. 1 to the Subrecipient Agreement (R2021-0045) with The Lord's Place Inc., to extend the end date from June 30, 2021 to June 30,2022 and increase funding by \$1,052,023 for a new total amount not-to-exceed \$2,270,023, to provide emergency shelter, rapid re-housing, outreach, and street engagement services for the homeless to prevent the spread of COVID-19; and
- **D) authorize** the County Administrator, or designee, to execute grant agreements and amendments thereto, and all other necessary documents related to the DCF Unified Homeless Grant.

Summary: DCF received \$65,511,297 in Emergency Solutions Grant Coronavirus (ESG-CV2) funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The ESG-CV2 funding is used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the pandemic among individuals and families who are homeless or receiving homeless assistance. The funding is also being used to support additional assistance and prevention services for the homeless to help mitigate the impacts created by the pandemic. Amendment No.0002 to Grant Contract #IP004 (CFSA 60.021) with DCF will be amended to reflect an increase in ESG-CV2 funding in the amount of \$1,052,023, which became effective on May 1, 2021. The Lord's Place Inc. provides emergency shelter, rapid re-housing, outreach, and street engagement services for the homeless to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. No County match is required. (Division of Human Services) Countywide (HH)

Background and Justification: Since 2006, the Division of Human and Veteran services has acted as the lead agency for the local Continuum of Care. As a result of the 2009 Hearth Act, HUD implemented CoC Planning Projects to provide funds for the collaboration of the COC, which Palm Beach County is known as the Homeless and Housing Alliance. DCF's Office on Homelessness works in conjunction with HUD to provide funding opportunities to assist persons who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.
