RESOLUTION NO. R-2022-____

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH FLORIDA; ESTABLISHING A NEW SCHEDULE OF MAXIMUM RATES FOR IMMOBOLIZATION AND NON-CONSENT TOWING SERVICES, FEES AND FINES; **ESTABLISHING MINIMUM COMMERCIAL** INSURANCE LIMITS FOR EACH INSURANCE TYPE; AND REPEALING AND REPLACING RESOLUTION NO. R-2014-1622, RELATING TO THE TOWING AND IMMOBOLIZATION SERVICES ORDINANCE OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS CODIFIED IN THE PALM BEACH COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES.

WHEREAS, numerous persons and firms in Palm Beach County engage in the business of performing immobilizing, towing and recovery of motorized vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County Code Chapter 19, Article VIII (the "Towing and Immobilization Services Ordinance"), regulates the business of immobilizing, towing and storage services in Palm Beach County for the protection of the public; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County Code Chapter 19, Article VIII, regulates the maximum rates towing and immobilization companies shall charge consumers for non-consent tows and immobilization services and provides that such rates shall be established by Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 125.0103 (1) (c), Florida Statute, the County shall establish maximum rates for the immobilization of vehicles or vessels, towing of vehicles or vessels from private property, removal and storage of wrecked or disabled vehicles or vessels from an accident scene or for the removal and storage of vehicles or vessels in the event the owner is incapacitated, unavailable, or otherwise does not consent to the removal of the vehicle or vessel; and

WHEREAS, it is and in the best interest of the County, its citizens and its visitors to regulate the maximum rates charged for immobilization and non-consent towing services including associated fees such as mileage, storage, drop charges, extra time at scene, under water recovery, hazardous material clean up, after-hours gate access, administrative/lien, and credit card convenience fees; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County Code Chapter 19, Article VIII, provides for the payment of operating permit application fees, vehicle decal fees, and other fees; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County Code Chapter 19, Article VIII, requires a schedule of fines for violations of the Towing and Immobilization Services Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners desires to revise the current schedule of fees and fines relating to the Towing and Immobilization Services Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County Code Chapter 19, Article VIII, provides that it shall be unlawful for any immobilization or tow truck company to operate without maintaining specific types of commercial insurance and that the Board shall established the minimum insurance limits for each insurance type by Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

- A) The Palm Beach County Towing and Immobilization Services Ordinance schedule for fees, fines, and insurance applicable to the business of towing and storage is hereby adopted as referenced in the chart entitled "Exhibit "A" Palm Beach County Towing and Immobilization Services Ordinance Schedule of Maximum Rates for Immobilization and Non-Consent Tows, Fees and Fines, and Minimum Commercial Insurance Limit Requirements" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- B) Resolution No. R-2014-1622, previously adopted regarding the fees, fines, and maximum rates for services related to non-consent towing and recovery charged by towing and storage companies and establishing minimum insurance levels, is hereby repealed and replaced.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA; ESTABLISHING MAXIMUM RATES FOR SERVICES RELATED TO NONCONSENT TOWING AND RECOVERY IN PALM BEACH COUNTY; ESTABLISHING FEES REQUIRED BY THE TOWING ORDINANCE; ESTABLISHING CIVIL FINES REQUIRED BY THE TOWING ORDINANCE; ESTABLISHING THE MINIMUM INSURANCE LEVELS REQUIRED BY THE TOWING ORDINANCE AND RESCINDING AND REPEALING RESOLUTION NO. R-2005-1023.

WHEREAS, numerous persons and firms in Palm Beach County engage in the business of performing towing and recovery of motorized vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County Code Chapter 19, Article VIII, regulates the maximum rates towing companies can charge consumers for nonconsent tows and that such rates shall be established by Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County, its citizens and its visitors to regulate the maximum rates charged for nonconsent towing services; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County Code Chapter 19, Article VIII, provides for the payment of operating permit fees, vehicle decal fees and other fees; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County Code Chapter 19, Article VIII, requires a schedule of fines for violations of the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County Code Chapter 19, Article VIII, requires establishing minimum insurance levels for the various types of insurance required.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:
