in accordance with the Bid therefore and for and in consideration of the promises and of the covenants and agreements, and of the payments herein specified, to be made and performed by the Contractor and the Owner, the Contractor hereby covenants and agrees to and with the Owner to undertake and execute all of the said named work, in a good, substantial and workmanlike manner, and to furnish all the materials and all the tools and labor necessary to properly perform and complete the work ready for use, in strict accordance with all the provisions of the Contract including the following documents described below which are made a part hereof and incorporated herein by reference:

and to accept as full compensation for the satisfactory performance of this Contract the sum of **Three Hundred Ninety Five Thousand Five Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$395,500.00)**, **Total Bid Amount, Base Bid** for the **Fuel Farm Emergency Generator** at **Palm Beach County Glades Airport**.

The prices named in the Bid are for the completed work, and include the furnishing of all materials and all labor, tools, and appliances and all expense, direct or indirect, connected with the proper execution of the work and of maintaining the same until it is accepted by the Board of County Commissioners.

Time is of the essence. The Contractor shall commence the work to be performed under this Contract on the date set by the Owner in the written notice to proceed, continue the work with due diligence and shall complete the entire work per Attachment No. 2 to the Bid Form. Further, in the event interim milestone completion dates are established in Attachment No. 2 of the Bid Form for separable portions of the work, the Contractor agrees to complete said separable portions of the work in accordance with said milestone dates.

In case of failure on the part of the Contractor to complete the work within the time(s) specified in the Contract, or within such additional time(s) as may be granted by formal action of the Board of County Commissioners or fails to prosecute the work, or any separable part thereof, with such diligence as will insure its completion within the time(s) specified in the Contract or any extensions thereof, Owner will suffer damage, the amount of which is difficult, if not impossible to ascertain. Therefore, the Contractor shall pay to the Owner, as liquidated damages, the amounts indicated in the Milestone and Damages Data (Attachment #2 of the Bid Form) for each calendar day of delay that actual completion extends beyond the time limits specified in said Attachment until such reasonable time as may be required for final completion of work. In no way shall costs for liquidated damages be construed as a penalty on the Contractor.

Liquidated damages due to the Owner may be deducted from payments due to the Contractor, or may be collected from the Contractor or its surety or sureties. These provisions for liquidated damages shall not prevent the Owner, in case of the Contractor's default, from terminating the Contractor's right to proceed as provided in General Provision section 80-09 "Default and Termination of Contract".

As provided in F.S. 287.132-133, by entering into this contract or performing any work in furtherance hereof, the contractor certifies that it, its affiliates, suppliers, subcontractors and consultants who will perform hereunder, have not been placed on the Convicted Vendor List maintained by the State of Florida Department of Management Services within the 36 months immediately preceding the date hereof. This notice is required by F.S. 287.133 (3) (a).



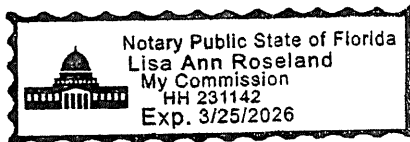

AECOM Technical Services, Inc. (AECOM) has reviewed the submitted bids for the referenced project. The Bid Opening was conducted on May 24, 2022, at 2:00 PM, the established deadline for submission of bids.

A total of four (4) bids were received for this project from the following contractors: All Florida Contracting Services, LLC, Hypower, LLC, EAU Gallie Electric, and Alen Construction Group. The four contractor bids and the Engineer's Estimate are presented in the table below.

AECOM's review of the bids indicated the following:

- All Florida Contracting Services, LLC., the lowest Bidder, completed the Bid Form and included the acknowledgment of all addenda (3) and all necessary attachments per the bid documents, except for the first page of the Bid Bond (page BF-8). All Florida Contracting Services, LLC. acknowledged Addendum number 2, however, the revisions made per this addendum were not incorporated as part of attachment No. 2 to the Bid Form. AECOM has confirmed All Florida Contracting Services, LLC., as the Prime Contractor, will perform 100% of the work.
- Hypower, LLC. completed the Bid Form and necessary attachments as required per the bid documents, including the acknowledgment of two (2) of the three (3) issued addenda. Hypower, LLC. failed to acknowledge Addendum number 3. Hypower, LLC. as the Prime Contractor, will perform 100% of the work.
- EAU Gallie Electric completed the Bid Form and all necessary attachments as required per the bid documents, including the acknowledgment of all three (3)



issued addenda. As the Prime Contractor, EAU Gallie Electric will perform a minimum of 86% of the work.

- Alen Construction Group completed the Bid Form and all necessary attachments as required per the bid documents, including the acknowledgment of all three (3) issued addenda. As the Prime Contractor, Alen Construction Group will perform a minimum of 30% of the work.

Each Bidder provided a list of previous projects validating their qualifications, capabilities, and experience with their Bid. The bidders provided references for support of their work experience, and AECOM verified a sample of references from the lowest bidders. All Florida Contracting Services, LLC., the lowest bidder, received positive references for their work, which included generator installation and site work similar to that required under this contract. Hypower, LLC., has previous experience providing similar services for the Palm Beach County Department of Airports (DOA) and AECOM is very familiar with the work they perform.

AECOM's review showed all Bids were calculated correctly on the individual Bid Price Forms.

A total of four (4) proposals were reviewed in response to the solicitation issued for the Fuel Farm Emergency Generator at the Palm Beach County Glades Airport (PHK).

The proposal received from **Eau Gallie Electric**, has been found non-responsive for failure to submit evidence of good faith efforts to achieve the DBE goal. The Schedule 3 documentation is incomplete and several sections are completely blank. Further, Schedule 3 documentation reflects that any effort made to meet the DBE goal, began only five (5) days prior to the proposal opening date.

The remaining three (3) proposals are responsive to the solicitation, each having meet or exceeded the DBE participation goal of 8.22%.
