

Summary – Continued from page one: Pursuant to Palm Beach County Code, Chapter 13, Article II, EMS Ordinance, any agency desiring to provide primary ALS and BLS transport services in Palm Beach County, must submit an application to the County and meet the requirements for issuance of a COPCN. Applications for primary providers are issued every six (6 years) for a six-year term. Since January 1, 2016, the same eleven primary providers requesting approval today for a COPCN have been the recipient of the primary provider COPCNs in Palm Beach County, which expire December 31, 2022. Eleven (11) applications for primary provider COPCNs were received. The EMS Ordinance Administrator's responsibilities include reviewing the applications for compliance with the EMS Ordinance application requirements, consideration of the need for the proposed services in the requested area, and preparing a report with recommendations for the EMS Advisory Council (Council). The Administrator's report with the recommendations on all applications was subsequently submitted to the Council for their review and recommendations. All of the eleven (11) applicants met the requirements for issuance of their respective COPCN's with requested endorsements to specify level of service and geographic area requested. On November 17, 2022, the Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council (EMS Council) reviewed the applications and supporting documentation and has recommended approval. **Countywide (SB)**

Background and Policy Issues: The EMS Ordinance establishes the requirement for the issuance of a six (6) year COPCN. All EMS agencies wishing to operate in the County, must apply every six years to obtain a COPCN. The COPCN term will be from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2028. The Applicants have met the requirements of Florida Statutes Chapter 401 as well as the requirements of the EMS ordinance. The Palm Beach County Division of Emergency Management and the EMS Advisory Council have reviewed the COPCN applications and have found them to be in compliance with the EMS Ordinance.

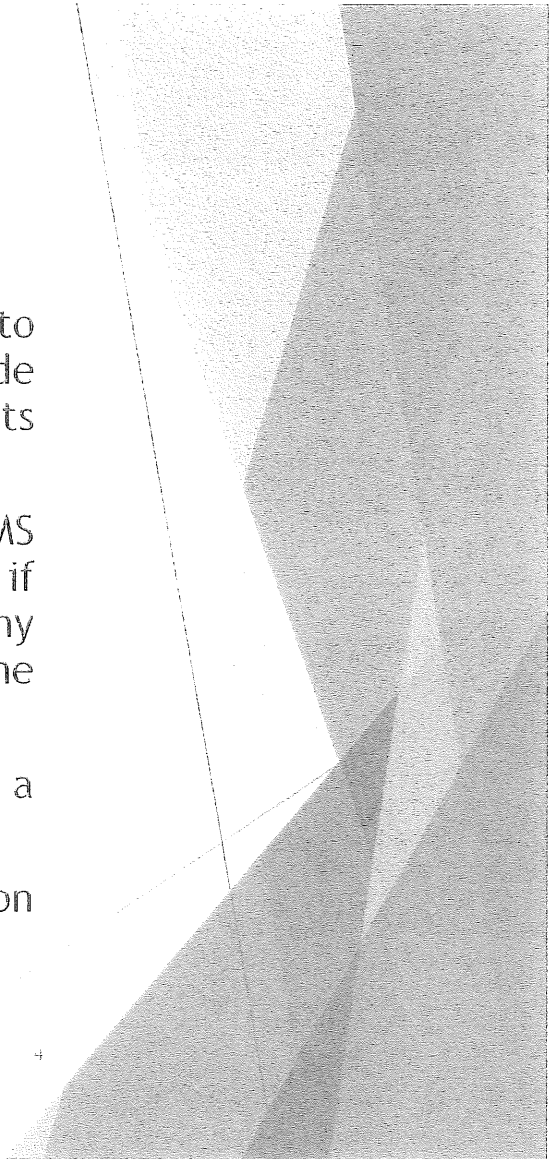
- FL Statute Ch. 401.25 authorizes the County to issue COPCNs.
- COPCN - a certificate deeming it to be in the public convenience and necessity for an Emergency Medical Provider to operate within confines of the County.
- PBC EMS Ordinance provides standards for issuing COPCNs in accordance with State guidelines.
- EMS Ordinance outlines requirements for the application.

Types of COPCN's

- 1) Primary - provides Advanced Life Support services which may include ALS and BLS transports.
- 2) Secondary - provides secondary ALS transport services and ALS and BLS inter-facility transport services.
- 3) Special Secondary - provides ALS non-transport services within a community until the primary provider arrives.

Primary Service Provider

- Agencies designated by the Board of County Commissioners to provide Advanced Life Support (ALS) Services which may include Basic Life Support (BLS) transport within the area(s) indicated on its COPCN
- Governmental entities having a public mandate to provide EMS within their jurisdiction may be granted a COPCN by the Board and if approved, may serve such jurisdiction as the primary provider. Any government entity requesting a COPCN must comply with the requirements set for in this Division.
- Applications for Primary Providers are issued every six (6) years for a six (6) year term
- Current Palm Beach County Primary Provider COPCN's expire on December 31, 2022



Current Primary COPCN Application Requirements

- Annual Comprehensive Financial Reports
- Proposed rate structure
- Except for current COPCN holders, a summary history of performance record providing ALS services
- Must have at least one (1) supervisory or higher level employee who possesses a minimum of three (3) years of experience in pre-hospital ALS Services
- Disclosure of litigation involving patient care
- Implementation of a formal quality assurance system
- Proof of satisfactory completion of all federal, state and/or local agency inspections for the last six (6) years. Current COPCN holders need not provide inspections performed by the Department (except deficiencies reports)
- Must have an Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD) program
- Sufficient number of ALS Agency vehicles
- Letter from Fire Chief that agency met federal/state/local requirements on delivery of EMS
- Application Fee

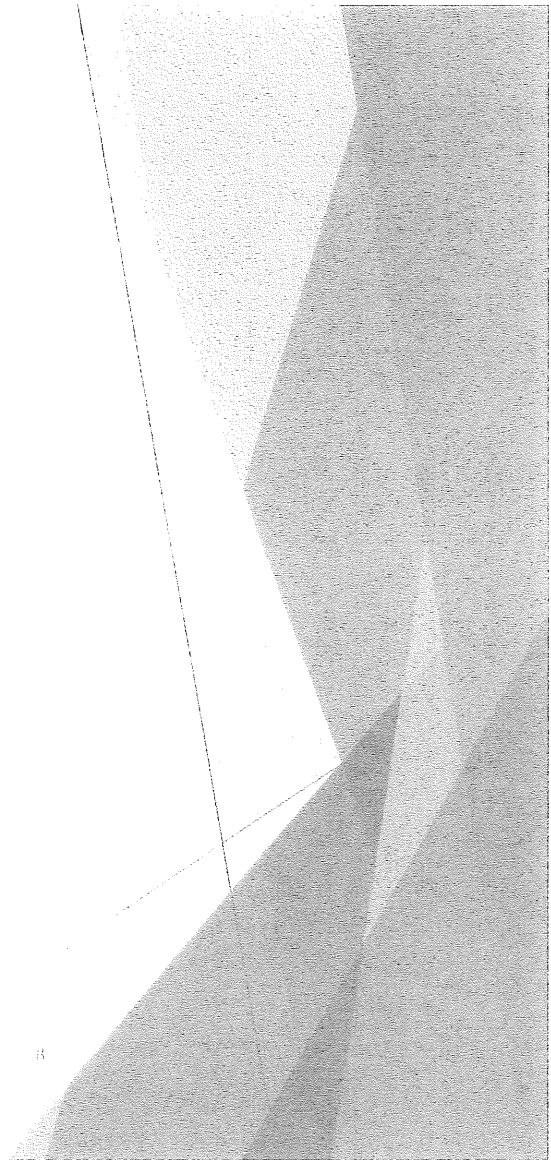

Administrator's Responsibilities

- Review the application and obtain verification applicant meets requirements of all federal, state and local laws

EMS Council Responsibilities

- Review the Administrator's report of application
- Applicant may provide a presentation
- Council members can ask questions after applicant report is presented
- A motion will be made by the Council member and seconded by another to recommend to the BCC to approve or deny applicant

Board of County Commissioners Meeting

- Administrator will publish a Notice of Public Hearing one (1) time in a newspaper at least ten (10) days prior to December 20, 2022.
- Applicants are encouraged to attend the BCC Public Hearing and will be allowed 3 minutes to speak if a public comment card is timely completed.
- Administrator will provide a report to the BCC, the recommendation of the EMS Council, and relevant documentation.
- BCC will approve or deny applications at the scheduled Public Hearing meeting on December 20, 2022.

Staff recommendation

Based on the information submitted in the Primary Provider applications, all eleven (11) agencies are compliant with the operational requirements of Palm Beach County and all State Rules and Statutes.

The purpose of this memo is to provide a recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) regarding the eleven (11) Primary Service Providers renewing their Primary Service Provider Emergency Medical Services (EMS) COPCN's for the period January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2028.

Pursuant to Palm Beach County Code, Chapter 13, Article II, titled EMS Ordinance, Section 13-23- Review and Assessment of Application:

- (a) Upon receipt of an application, the Administrator shall review the application and obtain verification that the applicant meets the requirements of all applicable federal, state and local laws. The Administrator's review shall include consideration of the need for the proposed service in the requested area;
- (b) Upon finalization of the review, the Administrator shall prepare a report with recommendation, which shall be forwarded to the applicant and to the EMS Council. The Administrator shall schedule an EMS Council meeting to request an EMS Council recommendation on the application to be provided to the Board. The applicant and affected COPCN Holder will be provided with notice of the EMS Council meeting and may be heard concerning the application at the EMS Council meeting prior to EMS Council recommendation.

(c) The Administrator shall request the Board set a date for a public hearing to consider the application any time after the completion of the Administrator's report provided, however, the Administrator shall obtain the recommendation of the EMS Council prior to the public hearing date.

(d) The Administrator's report and the recommendation of the EMS Advisory Council will be provided to the BCC for consideration at the public hearing.

On November 17, 2022, the EMS Advisory Council reviewed the Administrator's report on the eleven (11) Primary Service Provider applications. A vote was taken on each Primary Service Provider to approve for a Primary Service Provider COPCN to the following Primary Service Providers for the period of January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2028:



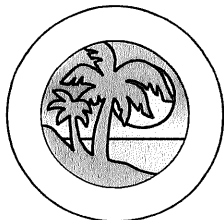

Applications for primary providers are issued every six (6) years) for a six-year term. Since January 1, 2016, the same eleven primary providers requesting approval today for a COPCN have been the recipient of the primary provider COPCNs in Palm Beach County, which expire December 31, 2022. Eleven (11) applications for primary provider COPCNs were received. The EMS Ordinance Administrator's responsibilities include reviewing the applications for compliance with the EMS Ordinance application requirements, consideration of the need for the proposed services in the requested area, and preparing a report with recommendations for the EMS Advisory Council (Council). Therefore, the following eleven (11) agencies are recommended for approval of a Primary EMS COPCN to provide Advanced Life Support (ALS), ALS Transport and Basic Life Support (BLS) transport services in Palm Beach County with appropriate endorsements defining geographic service area and service type, each for a six-year term commencing on January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2028:

1. City of Boca Raton Fire Rescue: Service area to include the municipal boundaries of the City of Boca Raton.

2. City of Boynton Beach Fire Rescue: Service area to include the municipal boundaries of the City of Boynton Beach, the Town of Hypoluxo, Town of Ocean Ridge, Town of Briny Breezes and the Village of Golf.
3. City of Delray Beach Fire Rescue: Service area to include the municipal boundaries of the City of Delray Beach and the Town of Gulfstream; and the Town of Highland Beach through April 30, 2024 when the interlocal service agreement terminates.
4. City of Greenacres Fire Rescue: Service area to include the municipal boundaries of the City of Greenacres and the City of Atlantis.
5. Village of North Palm Beach Fire Rescue: Service area to include the municipal boundaries of the Village of North Palm Beach.
6. Palm Beach County Fire Rescue: Service area to include all unincorporated areas of Palm Beach County and within the municipal boundaries of those municipalities that contracted for service or are in the Fire Rescue MSTU or Jupiter MSTU. These areas include Belle Glade, Cloud Lake, Glen Ridge, Haverhill, Jupiter, Juno Beach, Lake Clarke Shores, Lake Park, Lake Worth Beach, Lantana, Loxahatchee Groves, Manalapan, Pahokee, Palm Springs, Royal Palm Beach, South Bay, South Palm Beach, Wellington, and Westlake. Air Ambulance (Countywide)
7. Town of Palm Beach Fire Rescue: Service area to include the municipal boundaries of the Town of Palm Beach.
8. City of Palm Beach Gardens Fire Rescue: Service area to include the municipal boundaries of the City of Palm Beach Gardens.
9. City of Riviera Beach Fire Rescue: Service area to include the municipal boundaries of the City of Riviera Beach and the Town of Palm Beach Shores.
10. Village of Tequesta Fire Rescue: Service area to include the municipal boundaries of the Villages of Tequesta and Jupiter Inlet Colony; and the four (4) geographical areas covered by an Interlocal Agreement with Palm Beach County Fire Rescue.
11. City West Palm Beach Fire Department: Service area to include the municipal boundaries of the City of West Palm Beach and the Town of Mangonia Park.
