I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to adopt a Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida, approving a revised Schedule of Fees for the Department of Environmental Resources Management (ERM), and repealing Resolutions R-2009-2017 and R-1994-1052. A number of fees to be charged for permit approval, approval applications and related services that are provided for by the Unified Land Development Code (ULDC) and the Palm Beach County Code are being modified or eliminated.

Summary: The Resolution is an update of the existing Schedule of Fees (last adopted on November 17, 2009) to more closely reflect the costs of services provided by ERM. The fees are modified to partially offset ERM administrative costs related to the review and processing of ULDC required processes and for building permit plan review. The Resolution does not create any new fees and eliminates three fees. Specifically, the equestrian use permit fee, a fee for an additional vegetation inspection and the fee for File Searches are being eliminated as each are no longer applicable to today's processes. In addition, ERM is including the Environmental Reviews Section D.2. fees in its proposed Schedule of Fees that were previously referenced in the Planning, Zoning and Building (PZB) Department Schedule of Fees, Resolution R-2008-1754, as amended. The fees provided for in the Resolution are expected to generate an additional \$59,886 in revenue annually to offset the cost of services. Countywide (SF)

Background and Justification: See Exhibit "A" of the Resolution and Fee Change Analysis. The ERM collected fees have not changed since November 17, 2009. The Fee Change Analysis explains each fee being changed. Some fees are being modified and some eliminated. On July 22, 2022, PZB and ERM hosted a meeting with the development industry to discuss fee revisions each Department was proposing to their respective Schedule of Fees. There were no comments or objections on the items proposed. PZB's proposed changes are by separate agenda item, and traveling concurrently with this request.

RESOLUTION OF THE **BOARD** OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PALM BEACH OF COUNTY, FLORIDA, APPROVING A REVISED SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES MANAGEMENT AS ESTABLISHED UNDER RESOLUTION R-2009-2017, MODIFYING ELIMNATING FEES TO BE CHARGED FOR PERMIT APPROVAL AND APPROVAL APPLICATIONS AND RELATED SERVICES PROVIDED FOR BY THE UNIFIED LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE (ULDC) AND THE PALM BEACH COUNTY CODE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF RESOLUTIONS R-1994-1052 AND R-2009-2017; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY.

WHEREAS, the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code, the Palm Beach County Code, and other applicable laws provide that the official schedule of fees to be imposed by the Department of Environmental Resources Management (ERM) for the services it provides shall be adopted by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners;

WHEREAS, it is necessary for ERM to impose certain fees in order to defray the costs of the services it provides to the public; and

WHEREAS, the Schedule of Fees previously adopted by the Board of County Commissioners on November 17, 2009 no longer adequately reflects expenses incurred by ERM and contains some fees that are no longer applicable; and

WHEREAS, certain fees in the Schedule of Fees are adjusted each year according to the Consumer Price Index (CPI), as provided in Resolution R-2008-1754, as amended, so that the fees do not lag far behind the cost of the services provided; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined that the Schedule of Fees attached hereto as Exhibit "A" is reasonably related to the cost of services provided by ERM.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

3. FEE FOR PERMIT TO APPLY PESTICIDES IN WELLFIELD ZONES:

All applicants for a Permit to Apply Pesticides in Wellfield Zones shall pay a non-refundable filing fee in the amount of \$200. The filing fee shall be paid prior to acceptance of the permit application for review. The fee shall be used to defray the cost of administering Article 14.B., ULDC.

For facilities with a combination of the wellfield permit and permit to apply pesticides "Wellfield Operating Permit to Apply Pesticides", the fee shall be the wellfield operating permit fee for that zone.

CLOSURE PERMIT FEE:

All applicants for a Closure Permit shall pay a fee equal to one-half (1/2) of the fee for the Wellfield Protection Operating Permit Application.

PERMIT TRANSFER FEE:

The fee for transfer of any Wellfield Protection Operating Permit, Permit to Apply Pesticides or Closure Permit shall be \$75 to defray the cost of processing the transfer.

6. ANNUAL PERMIT RENEWAL FEE:

Beginning October 2, 1990, all permittees shall pay an annual permit renewal fee for each permitted facility to defray the costs of administering Article 14.B., ULDC. The fee shall be paid according to the following schedule:

Unless the calculation under the above schedule would be for a lesser amount, entities that own or manage 20 or more facilities shall pay an annual permit renewal fee of \$2000. All permits issued prior to September 30, 1990, are subject to an annual fee for the year beginning on the following October 1. Any permits issued in subsequent years are subject to an annual fee the following October 1.

7. SPECIAL EXEMPTION FEE:

Any person seeking a special exemption shall pay a fee of \$200 to defray the cost of processing the request, in addition to any appropriate permit fees.

8. GENERAL EXEMPTION FEE:

Any person seeking a general exemption pursuant to Article 14.B., shall pay a fee of \$100 to defray the cost of processing the request, in addition to the appropriate permit fees.

9. LATE FEE:

A fee of \$25 shall be charged if the application for permit or annual permit renewal fee is late. Should the application with associated fees not be provided within 60 days from the date due, then additional late fees of \$50 per month shall be charged until the application and fees are received.

10. MODIFICATION FEE:

All applicants for modification of any Wellfield Protection Operating permit in wellfield zones that requires the review of engineered plans for secondary containment or a groundwater monitoring plan, shall pay a fee of \$375 to defray the cost of processing the application.

2022 FEE CHANGE ANALYSIS 11/17/2022

On November 17, 2009, 13 years ago, the Board of County Commissioners, adopted the Schedule of fees for the Department of Environmental Resources Management (ERM) under Resolution R-2009-2017. ERM intends to evaluate and recommend changes, as needed, to this fee schedule every 3 years.

This fee analysis explains the changes described in Exhibit A, the actual changes in the Fee Schedule. The main driver of County costs during this time are the increases in salaries and benefits of staff between November 2009 and February 2022. Some considerations were process changes, frequency of review, staff rates, and the amount of time it takes to perform each task. An evaluation was undertaken regarding the continued need for each fee. The recommendation is to increase the majority of the fees in accordance with the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) Consumer Price Index (CPI). Between the dates of November of 2009 and February of 2022, the CPI increased by 31%. The fees are adjusted to reflect these considerations and a number of the fees reflect a portion of the time it takes for ERM staff to perform a given task. On July 22, 2022, PZB and ERM hosted a meeting with the development industry to discuss fee revisions each Department was proposing respectively. There were no comments or objections on the items proposed. PZB's proposed changes are by separate item, and traveling concurrently with this request.

Since the Schedule of fees for ERM adoption in 2009, Section A., Sea Turtle Protection and Sand Preservation fees have not changed, while the cost in salaries and benefits have increased. The proposed fees represent increases based on a consideration of CPI increase and re-assessment of staff effort to process applications. For Section B., Natural Areas, the equestrian use fee is no longer charged and therefore removed from the fee structure. The estimated cumulative annual increase for Section A. is \$2,160 with no increase expected for Section B.

For Section C., Wellfield Protection, the current fees do not reflect the actual cost of the program. At the program's inception, discussions with the Board of County Commissioners and the writers of the Ordinance indicated that the County as a whole would partially cover the cost of administering and processing operating permits and annual fees as the County benefits by the protection of regional groundwater. Since 2009, County costs for salary and benefits have increased with no fee adjustment. Depending on the category, the proposed fees represent an increase based on a consideration of CPI. The estimated cumulative annual increase for Section C. is \$19,865.

The Section D.2., Environmental Review fees were originally referenced in PZB's Resolution R-2008-1754, Fee Schedule. Under that Resolution the fees have increased annually by CPI since 2012. These fees are now moved from the PZB Fee Schedule to ERM's Fee Schedule under Section D.2. They will continue to be subject to annual CPI adjustments and collected through the ePZB system. Also proposed are increases to the

Environmental Review and Environmental Revision fees to more accurately reflect process changes due to code revisions and staffing changes to further cover current staff salary and benefit expenses. The proposal is to increase the fees for Section D.2 Environmental Evaluation (4350) from \$241.00 to \$400.00 and the Environmental Evaluation – Review of Revision (4351) from \$181.00 to \$350.00. Section D.2 has also been updated to reflect the current fee for Development of Regional Impact (DRI) Environmental Evaluation (4355), which is not being increased. The estimated cumulative annual increase for Section D. Environmental Review is \$20,177.

The Section E., Vegetation Preservation and Protection fees are increased with consideration of CPI to more adequately offset County costs and the additional vegetation inspection fee is eliminated due to implementation considerations. The estimated annual cumulative increase for Section E. Vegetation Protection is \$11,149.

The remaining Section F., Excavation, fees also have not changed since 2009. Recommended is to increase these fees with consideration of the CPI. The estimated cumulative annual increase for Section D. Environmental Review is \$6,485.

The Section G., File Searches fee is eliminated as information requests of this type have not been requested for a number of years. Records are made available electronically with staff assistance through a public records request or through use of other available on-line databases, such as Oculus.

Conclusion

Increases are recommended for most fees in order to reflect a portion of the actual County costs to review, inspect, and process applications related to the Unified Land Development Codes that ERM oversees. The majority of the fees are increased to more accurately reflect County costs based on salary and benefit increase with consideration of CPI. Some fees are increased based on process time. There are no new fees and three (3) fees are eliminated. Specifically, the equestrian use permit fee, a fee for an additional vegetation inspection, and the fee for File Searches are each eliminated as they are no longer applicable to today's processes.

The overall annual revenue increase associate with this proposal is anticipated to be approximately \$59,886.

WHEREAS, this staff person would expedite and streamline the process for applicants by advising them early in the process of necessary permits; and

WHEREAS, the new fee which is based on a per permit rate, excluding Type 1 permits, will defray the costs of providing environmental reviews of building permit applications at the One-Stop Permit Center; and

SECTION 4. Repeal of Resolutions in Conflict

All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

FEE CHANGE ANALYSIS

D: /_RP/ Fee Change Analysis 10_23_2009

Five years ago on November 16, 2004, the Schedule of Fees was adopted under Resolution R-2004-2374, after no previous increases for 5 years. On September 23, 2008, The Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners adopted changes to the Unified Land Development Code, Article 14.C., Vegetation Protection and Preservation Code. The fee schedule was not concurrently modified to reflect these changes. The fee analysis is provided to explain the changes described in Exhibit A, the actual changes in the Fee Schedule. As the fees have not changed since 2004, costs in salaries and benefits have increased between 20% and 25% over the past 5 years. Not all fees are being modified. Seven (7) fees have been eliminated based on code changes. Some fees have significantly increased due to the time needed to review, inspect, or process an application. There are no new fees.

Sea Turtle Lighting fees have not changed since 2004 while the cost in salaries and benefits increased between 20% and 25%. The proposed application fee represents a 15% increase to more closely offset costs. This represents 65% of processing costs.

Wellfield Protection fees do not reflect the actual cost of the program. However, the actual costs are provided for comparison. At the inception of the program, discussions with the Board of County Commissioners and the writers of the Ordinance indicated that the County as a whole would partially cover the cost of administering and processing operating permits and annual fees as the County benefits from protection of groundwater. The fee increases are based on an approximate overall 15%, depending on the category.

The environmental review fee found in Resolution No. R-94-1052 requires \$3 for all building permit application types with the exception of a Type 1 building permit application. Florida Statute 553.80 which pertains to the Florida Building Code, restricts the Planning, Zoning and Building, Building Division to only charge applications that receive a review. Revisions to the Vegetation Preservation and Protection Code significantly reduced the number of plan reviews that require an environmental review. Only some Type 4, 6 and 9, commercial, governmental, and agricultural activities for the purposes of vegetation protection, wellfield protection, storage tank compliance, and stormwater pollution prevention along with building permit applications needing a sea turtle lighting plan for coastal construction require an environmental review. Proposed is incorporating the fee identified by Resolution No. R-94-1052 into the Schedule of Fees, charge only those applications that require review, and increase the fee to \$15 to reflect actual review time. Due to the significant reduction of plan reviews conducted, no revenue increase is anticipated.

Vegetation protection changes reflect the revised Vegetation Protection and Preservation Code, as adopted on September 28, 2008. Language is revised to reflect the Approval for Protection of Native Vegetation process in lieu of a Standard Permit. Fees remain the same with the following 7 fees being eliminated:

- 1) Minor Vegetation Alteration;
- 2) Specimen Tree Removal;
- Standard Permit for Single Family Residential Use and Agricultural Parcels less than 10 acres gross size;
- 4) Review of Prohibitive Eradication Plans;
- Standard Permit in advance of Building Permit or Land Development through Performance Guarantee;
- 6) Deminimus Permit; and
- 7) Failure to Obtain Permit for Exotic Removal.

Excavation fees for non-mining activities are increased 15% to partially offset County costs. Type III mining operations application fees have been separated and significantly increased to more accurately reflect the cost of processing this type of application due to the associated technical complexity. Fees are based on staff time for preliminary meetings, inspection, surety processing, review of monitoring plans, water quality data, phasing, and engineering plans.

The overall annual revenue increase associated with this proposal is approximately \$23,441. Evaluation of the fee structure changes is as follows:

A. SEA TURTLE PROTECTION AND SAND PRESERVATION

SEA TURTLE LIGHTING PLAN APPROVALS:

FEE ANALYSIS

An average of 24 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time for inspections and processing a sea turtle lighting application with 1 hr supervisory review and 0.25 hrs of secretarial time. Review and processing of modification applications require significantly less time on average.

Application: 24.00 X \$59.44 = \$1,426.56 1.00 X \$79.58 = 79.58 0.25 X \$22.84 = 5.71 \$1,511.85

Modification: 2.50 X \$59.44 = \$148.60 0.50 X \$79.58 = 39.79 0.25 X \$22.84 = 5.71 \$194.10

The increase in cost for each application type is by 15%. The estimated annual revenue increase is \$475.

C. WELLFIELD PROTECTION

WELLFIELD PROTECTION OPERATING PERMIT APPLICATION FEE:

FEE ANALYSIS

Wellfield Zone 1 and Zone 2: An average of 10 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr) for notification, completeness summary, application review, processing surety, and permitting; 1 hr of a Hydrogeologist's time (\$71.01) for monitor well placement and methods; 6 hours of an Environmentalist's time (\$49.83) for initial and post permit inspections; and 1 hour for supervisory review (\$79.58/hr).

The increase in cost is \$90 or 15% for a permit fee of \$690.

Wellfield Zone 3

The cost is the same as above less 1 hour Hydrogeologist time - 71.01 \$972.96

The increase in cost is \$55 or 14% for a permit fee of \$440.

Wellfield Zone 4

An average of 3 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr); 5 hours of an Environmentalist's time (\$49.83) for initial and post permit inspections; and 0.5 hour for supervisory review (\$79.58/hr).

The increase in cost is \$45 or 15% for a permit fee of \$350.

Permit to Apply Pesticides in Wellfield Zones:

The increase in cost is \$20 or 13% for a permit application fee of \$170.

In Fiscal Year 2009 there were 0-Zone 1&2, 3-Zone 3, 56-Zone 4 and 5-notifications for a Permit to Apply Pesticides in Wellfield Zones. The estimated annual revenue increase would be \$2,785.

PERMIT TRANSFER FEE:

FEE ANALYSIS

An average of 1 hr Environmental Analyst time (\$59.44), 0.25 of a supervisory and 0.5 hour of secretarial time is needed.

1.0 X \$59.44 = 59.44 0.25 X \$79.58 = 19.90 0.5 X \$49.83 = 24.92 \$104.26

Most requests are received at the time of annual billing and are in lieu of a Zone 4 annual renewal, therefore the fee should be at least the same as a Zone 4 permit annual renewal fee of \$60. A \$10, or 15%, increase is recommended for a total fee of \$60. In Fiscal Year 2009 there were 15 permit transfers for an estimated annual revenue increase of \$150.

ANNUAL PERMIT RENEWAL FEE

FEE ANALYSIS

An average of 6 hours of an Environmentalist's time (\$49.83) is needed to inspect a Zone 1 or Zone 2 facility. An average of 2 hours of an Environmentalist's time is needed to inspect a Zone 3 facility. Zone 1, 2 and 3 facilities are inspected twice annually. An average of 2 hours of an Environmentalist's time is needed to inspect a Zone 4 facility annually. There is a 25% re-inspection rate.

Zone 1:

6.0 X \$49.83 = \$298.98

The increase is \$30 or 14% for a renewal fee of \$200.

Zone 2:

6.0 X \$49.83 = \$298.98

The increase is \$15 or 12% for a renewal fee of \$140.

Zone 3:

4.0 X \$49.83 = \$199.32

The increase is \$10 or 11% for a renewal fee of \$100.

Zone 4:

2.0 X \$49.83 = \$ 99.66

The annual renewal fee for a Zone 4 facility has never been increased. A \$10 increase, 20%, is requested for a Zone 4 renewal fee of \$60.00.

In Fiscal Year 2009, 16-Zone 1, 73-Zone 2, 64-Zone 3, 883-Zone 4 facilities were billed, the expected annual revenue increase is \$10,965.

MODIFICATION:

FEE ANALYSIS

An average of 6 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr) for application review, pre-permit inspection, permit issuance and follow-up inspection; and 0.5 hour for supervisory review (\$79.58/hr).

The increase is \$35 or 150% for a permit fee of \$285. The annual revenue increase is expected to be approximately \$350.

D. ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEWS

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW OF BUILDING PERMIT PLANS:

FEE ANALYSIS

<u>Plan Review</u>: An average of 15 minutes per application of a Senior Environmental Analyst's time is needed to review the packet, comment and enter into the database.

The fee increase is from \$3 to \$15, but will impact a significantly smaller number of plan reviews. Assuming only 128 reviews, the anticipated revenue increase of \$1,536.

F. EXCAVATION

TYPE II, NON-BONA FIDE AGRICULTURE, AND WEST COUNTY AGRICULTURAL EXCAVATION APPROVALS:

FEE ANALYSIS

Type II, Non-Bona Fide Agriculture, and WCAA Excavation Approval

An average of 6 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr) for application review, completeness summary, processing surety, and NIC Approval; 15.5 hours of an Environmentalist's time (\$49.83) for Time Zero, 90, 180, 360 and 730 monitoring report review/inspections and correspondence preparation; 0.5 hours for secretary for mailings; and 4 hours of an Environmental Program Supervisors time (\$79.58/hr) for pre-application meetings, supervisory review, database oversight and tracking.

6.0 X \$59.44 = \$ 356.64 15.50 X\$49.83 = 772.37 0.50 X\$22.84 = 11.42 4.00 X \$79.58 = 318.32 \$1,458.75

The increase is \$105 or 15% for a permit fee of \$805.

Type II Administrative Waiver

The increase is \$25 or 16% for a permit fee of \$175.

<u>Type II - Each Additional Lake - Littoral Zone Compliance Inspections</u>
An average of 6.0 hours of an Environmentalist's time (\$49.83) for monitoring report review and inspections.

6.0 X \$49.83 = \$298.98

The increase is \$25 or 16% for a fee of \$175.

Type II NIC Modification

An average of 4 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr) for modification review, completeness summary, processing surety, and correspondence preparation; 3.0 hours of an Environmentalist's time (\$49.83) for monitoring report review and inspections; 0.5 hours for secretary for mailings; and 1.0 hour of an Environmental Program Supervisors time (\$79.58/hr) for supervisory review.

4.0 X\$59.44 = \$ 237.76 3.0 X\$49.83 = 149.49 0.5 X\$22.84 = 11.42 1.00 X \$79.58 = 79.58 \$478.25

The increase is \$35 or 15% for a permit fee of \$285.

Based on 2 applications, the estimated annual revenue increase is expected to be \$1520.

BONA FIDE EXCAVATION APPROVALS- APPLICATION AND WAIVER:

FEE ANALYSIS

Bona fide Agriculture Excavation Approvals

An average of 8 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr) for application review, completeness summary, inspections, processing surety, and NiC Approval; 1 hr of a hydrogeologist's time (\$71.01) for geological study; 0.5 hours for secretary for mailings; and 5 hours of an Environmental Program Supervisors time (\$79.58/hr) for pre-application meetings, application review, supervisory review, database oversight, monitoring report review/inspections and correspondence preparation (\$79.58/hr).

8.0 X \$59.44 = \$475.52 1.00 X \$71.01 = 71.01 0.50 X \$22.84 = 11.42 5.00 X \$79.58 = 397.90 \$955.85 The increase is \$75 or 13% for a permit fee of \$625.

An average of 6 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr) for application review, completeness summary, inspections, processing surety, and NIC Approval; 2 hr of a hydrogeologist's time (\$71.01) for monitor well placement, methods and geological study; 0.5 hours for secretary for mailings; and 3 hours of an Environmental Program Supervisors time (\$79.58/hr) for pre-application meetings, application review, supervisory review, database oversight, monitoring report review/inspections and correspondence preparation (\$79.58/hr).

6.00 X \$59.44 = \$356.64 2.00 X \$71.01 = 142.02 0.50 X \$22.84 = 11.42 3.00 X \$79.58 = 238.74 \$748.82

The increase is \$25.00, or 16% for a fee of \$175.

Bona Fide Agriculture - Each Additional Lake - Littoral Zone Compliance Inspections
An average of 6.0 hours of an Environmentalist's time (\$49.83) for monitoring report review and inspections.

6.0 X \$49.83 = \$298.98

The increase is \$25 or 15% for a fee of \$175.

Bona fide Modification

An average of 4 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr) for modification review, completeness summary, processing surety, and correspondence preparation; 3.0 hours of an Environmentalist's time (\$49.83) for monitoring report review and inspections; 0.5 hours for secretary for mailings; and 1.0 hour of an Environmental Program Supervisors time (\$79.58/hr) for supervisory review.

4.0 X \$59.44 = \$237.76 3.0 X \$49.83 = 149.49 0.50 X\$22.84 = 11.42 1.00 X \$79.58 = 79.58 \$478.25

The increase is \$35.00, or 15% for a permit fee of \$285.00.

There were no applications in Fiscal Year 2009 and therefore, no annual revenue increase is anticipated.

TYPE III MINING EXCAVATION APPROVAL – APPLICATION WAIVER AND MODIFICATION:

FEE ANALYSIS

Type III Mining Excavation Approval

An average of 12 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr) for application review, completeness summary, inspections, processing surety, and NIC Approval; 2 hr of a Hydrogeologist's time (\$71.01) for monitor well placement, methods and geological study; 0.5 hours for secretary for mailings; and 24 hours of an Environmental Program Supervisors time (\$79.58/hr) for pre-application meetings, application review, supervisory review, database oversight, monitoring report review/inspections and correspondence preparation (\$79.58/hr).

12.00 X \$59.44 = \$ 713.28 2.00 X \$71.01 = 142.02 0.50 X \$22.84 = 11.42 24.00 X \$79.58 = 1,909.92 \$2,776.64

The amount of time needed to review a mining operation application was unknown at the time the original fee structure was established. Subsequent mining operation applications have required extensive processing efforts. The recommended increase is to more accurately reflect the true cost of processing a mining operation application. The recommended increase is \$1,900, 271%, for a fee of \$2,600 per mining operation application.

Type III Mining Excavation Administrative Waiver

An average of 4 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr) for application review, completeness summary, inspections, processing surety, and NIC Approval; 3 hours of a Hydrogeologist's time (\$71.01) for monitor well placement, methods and geological study; 0.5 hours for secretary for mailings; and 8 hours of an Environmental Program Supervisors time (\$79.58/hr) for pre-application meetings, application review, supervisory review, database oversight, monitoring report review/inspections and correspondence preparation (\$79.58/hr).

4.00 X \$59.44 = \$237.76 3.00 X \$71.01 = 213.03 0.50 X \$22.84 = 11.42 8.00 X \$79.58 = <u>636.64</u> \$1,098.85

The amount of time needed to review a mining operation administrative waiver request was unknown at the time the original fee structure was established. Subsequent waiver requests have required extensive processing efforts. The recommended increase is \$850 to more accurately reflect that true cost of processing for a mining operation. The recommended increase is \$850 or 560% for a fee of \$1,000.

Type III - Each Additional Mine Lake - Littoral Zone Compliance Inspections

An average of 16.0 hours of an Environmentalist's time (\$49.83) for monitoring report review and inspections.

The increase is \$350 or 233% for a fee of \$500.

Type III Mining Excavation Modification

An average of 10 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr) for application review, completeness summary, inspections, processing surety, and NIC Approval; 3 hr of a Hydrogeologist's time (\$71.01) for monitor well placement, methods and geological study; 0.5 hour for secretary for mailings; and 10 hours of an Environmental Program Supervisors time (\$79.58/hr) for pre-application meetings, application review, supervisory review, database oversight, monitoring report review/inspections and correspondence preparation (\$79.58/hr).

The increase is \$1,250 or 500% for an application fee of \$1500.

Type III Mining Excavation Annual Report

An average of 6 hours of an Environmental Analyst's time (\$59.44/hr) is anticipated for annual report review and follow-up.

The increase is \$40, or 15%, for a fee of \$325.

Two mining operation applications are anticipated annually for an expected revenue increase of \$5,660.
