**I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF**

**Motion and Title:** Staff recommends motion to: **A) Accept** on behalf of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, a contract amendment between the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office and the University of North Florida Training and Services Institute, Inc., d/b/a Institute of Police Technology and Management ("IPTM"), to provide \$50,000 in supplemental funding; and **(B) Approve** a budget amendment of \$50,000 in the Sheriff's Grants Fund.

**Summary:** The Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) accepted this grant award for \$91,144.70 on August 23, 2022 (R-2022-0873). On October 18, 2022, the BCC approved \$32,246.13 in supplemental funding (R-2022-1234). This agenda item will provide additional funds in the amount of \$50,000 which brings the total award to \$173,390.83. These funds will be used to pay for overtime costs associated with the High Visibility Enforcement (HVE) project to support the Florida Department of Transportation's Bicycle Pedestrian Focused Initiative. There is **no match requirement** associated with this award. The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number is 20.205, the project number is 433144-1-8404, and the FDOT Contract number is G2A92. Countywide (RS)

**Background and Justification:** The Florida Department of Transportation (DOT) awards grants from funds received from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration for Highway Safety projects. DOT sub-awarded these funds to the University of North Florida Training and Services Institute, Inc., d/b/a Institute of Police Technology and Management ("IPTM") to implement Florida's Bicycle Pedestrian Focused Initiative. A component of the plan is to fund law enforcement's effort to conduct high visibility enforcement details throughout high risk intersections

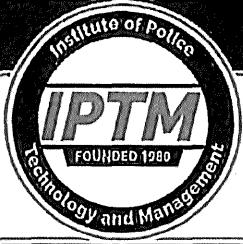


