Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to receive and file: Consultant Services Authorization (CSA) No. 29 to the project specific contract (R2015-1459) with Leo A. Daly Company (Consultant) in the amount of \$49,410 for the Detention Facilities Renewal and Replacement (R/R) Main Detention Center (MDC) Courtyard Area Mezzanine Walkway and Canopy project.

Summary: On October 20, 2015, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approved the project specific contract (R2015-1459) with the Consultant to provide professional services for various renewal/replacement (R/R) projects at County Detention Facilities. CSA No. 29 authorized professional services associated with the R/R of the existing 2<sup>nd</sup> floor exterior mezzanine walkways and canopies in the courtyard between Buildings A and B in the amount of \$49,410. In accordance with Policy and Procedure Memorandum (PPM) CW-F-050, when the cumulative value of changes or additional work exceeds the greater of \$250,000 or 5% of the original contract value (Threshold Amount), then an agenda item notifying the Board of the item that puts the cumulative value in the excess category must be presented as a receive and file. The cumulative value of CSAs, including CSA No. 29, totals \$263,333.12. This agenda item is being submitted to notify the Board that CSA No. 29 puts the cumulative value of additional work in excess of the \$250,000 Threshold Amount established by PPM CW-F-050. The Consulting Services/Design Professional Services contract for the Detention Facilities R/R projects was awarded under the Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Ordinance in place at the time with an SBE participation goal of 15%. There is no SBE participation on this CSA. Cumulative SBE participation on the contract is 24.30%. The Consultant is a Palm Beach County Business. Funding for this project is from the Infrastructure Sales Tax Fund. (Capital Improvements Division) District 3 (MWJ)

**Background and Justification**: The design professional was selected on August 6, 2015, pursuant to the Consultants Competitive Negotiation Act (CCNA), Florida Statute 287.055. CSA No. 29 authorized additional professional services associated with the the R/R of the existing 2nd floor exterior mezzanine walkways and canopies in the courtyard between Buildings A and B in the amount of \$49,410. To date, the amount for additional work totals \$263,333.12. This value exceeds the cumulative limits established in PPM CW-F-050, thus requiring a notification to the Board via a receive and file item.

# DETENTION FACILITIES RENEWAL/REPLACEMENT MAIN DETENTION CENTER (MDC) COURTYARD AREA MEZZANINE WALKWAY & CANOPY PROJECT NO. 15218

This Consultant Services Authorization #29 is for additional professional services for the Detention Facilities R/R – MDC Courtyard Area Mezzanine Walkway & Canopy project located at 3228 Gun Club Road in West Palm Beach.

Professional services shall include design and construction administration phase services for the renewal/replacement of the existing 2<sup>nd</sup> floor exterior mezzanine walkways and canopies in the Courtyard area between the A and B buildings.

Buildings A & B of the Main Detention Center are joined by a wide mezzanine area. The two-story exterior mezzanine area is approximately 40 years old. Select metal and finish surfaces are showing extensive deterioration. Areas requiring repair and/or replacement include the mezzanine walkway, handrails, canopy supports, fascia and concrete and stucco surfaces. Select areas of the South side of the Courtyard appear to be deteriorating due to roof drain issues that remain concealed. Additionally, east of the Courtyard, toward the Central Energy Plant, the roof rainwater system serving the walkway canopy is significantly deteriorated. Design efforts are targeted toward restoring these areas.

This contract was awarded under the County's prior SBE program. SBE participation for this CSA is 0%. When added to the Consultant's participation to date, the resulting SBE participation is 24.30%. The Consultant's contract goal is 15%.

CSA No. 16 authorized initial design phase including an assessment of the facility and preparation of schematics and approximately 50% Construction Document phase drawings and specifications for the PBSO IT Improvements at the Eagle Academy. CSA No. 17 authorized preparation of 50% - 95% construction documents (permit submittal) and specifications, bidding/permitting/negotiations and construction administration phase services. CSA No. 18 authorized additional design and construction administration services necessary to make additional electrical changes for new expanded electrical infrastructure needed to support "Call Taker Positions" layouts requested by PBSO IT. CSA No. 22 authorized a study of the existing conditions associated with the Fire Command Room and associated infrastructure. CSA No. 23 authorized design and construction administration phase services associated with renewal and replacement of existing plumbing infrastructure serving Building B 1st floor sanitary system and the East tower sanitary and storm system. CSA No. 24 authorized a 3rd party design professional to fill the Mechanical Smoke Tester / Certifier role for the work being performed at the East and South Towers at the Main Detention Center. CSA No. 24 authorized additional support and documentation of the portion of the existing electrical system which would be affected during the power disruption required in order to implement the installation of the new emergency power electrical infrastructure which includes new 600A circuit breakers associated with Phase III R/R. CSA No. 26 authorized additional design services associated with added infrastructure for PBSO IT in the East Tower. CSA No. 27 authorized structural condition assessment of the existing courtyard open stair and mezzanine walkways between the A and B buildings. CSA No. 28 authorized design and construction administration phase services for the replacement of 16 existing South Tower mechanical intake louvers located on the exterior perimeter walls.

4. Description of Services to be provided by Consultant: Professional services shall include design and construction administration phase services for the renewal/replacement of the existing 2<sup>nd</sup> floor exterior mezzanine walkways and canopies in the Courtyard area between the A and B buildings, as detailed on the attached proposal dated July 18, 2023. In the event of a conflict between the terms and conditions of the Contract and the terms and conditions of Consultant's proposal, the terms and conditions of the Contract shall control.

- 5. Compensation: The compensation to be paid to the Consultant for the requested services shall be: Lump Sum charge of \$49,410.00.
- 6. This CSA may be terminated, in whole or in part, by the County with or without cause in accordance with the Contract terms. In the event of termination not the fault of the Consultant, the Consultant shall be compensated for all services performed to termination date, together with reimbursable expenses (if applicable) then due in accordance with the Contract terms.

Consultant agrees to waive any and all claims for lost profits or anticipated future profits in the event of a termination with or without the cause under this Contract.

- 7. If not previously provided or for a new project, the Consultant shall provide County with an executed Conflict of Interest Disclosure Form, attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- 8. All terms, conditions, and obligations of the original Contract shall remain in full force and effect, unless specifically noted as follows:

#### E-VERIFY - EMPLOYMENT ELIGIBILITY

CONSULTANT warrants and represents that it is in compliance with section 448.095, Florida Statutes, as may be amended, and that it: (1) is registered with the E-Verify System (E-Verify.gov), and beginning January 1, 2021, uses the E-Verify System to electronically verify the employment eligibility of all newly hired workers; and (2) has verified that all of the CONSULTANT's subconsultants performing any duties and obligations under this Contract are registered with the E-Verify System and beginning January 1, 2021, use the E-Verify System to electronically verify the employment eligibility of all newly hired workers.

CONSULTANT shall obtain from each of its subconsultants an affidavit stating that the subconsultant does not employ, contract with, or subcontract with an Unauthorized Alien, as that term is defined in section 448.095(1)(k), Florida Statutes, as may be amended. CONSULTANT shall maintain a copy of any such affidavit from a subconsultant for, at a minimum, the duration of the subcontract and any extension thereof. This provision shall not supersede any provision of this Contract which requires a longer retention period.

COUNTY shall terminate this Contract if it has a good faith belief that CONSULTANT has knowingly violated Section 448.09(1), Florida Statutes as may be amended.

If COUNTY has a good faith belief that CONSULTANT's subconsultant has knowingly violated Section 448.09(1), Florida Statutes, as may be amended, COUNTY shall notify

CONSULTANT to terminate its contract with the subconsultant and CONSULTANT shall immediately terminate its contract with the subconsultant.

If COUNTY terminates this Contract pursuant to the above, CONSULTANT shall be barred from being awarded a future contract by COUNTY for a period of one (1) year from the date on which this Contract was terminated. In the event of such contract termination, CONSULTANT shall also be liable for any additional costs incurred by COUNTY as a result of the termination.

- 9. Time of Commencement: Consultant shall begin work immediately on the requested services upon receipt of this executed document which shall constitute official "Notice to Proceed".
- 10. This contract was awarded under the County's prior SBE program. SBE participation for this CSA is 55.71%. When added to the Consultant's participation to date, the resulting SBE participation is 24.30%. The Consultant's contract goal is 15%.

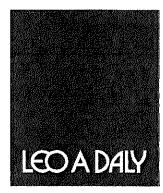

LEO A DALY is pleased to present this proposal to provide professional services for the Renewal / Replacement of the existing 2<sup>nd</sup>. Floor exterior mezzanine walkways and canopies in the Courtyard Area between the A and B Buildings scope of work at the Main Detention Center located at 3228 Gun Club Road, West Palm Beach, Florida 33406. Our proposal agreement is provided hereafter.

Whereas, LEO A DALY, 1400 Centrepark Blvd., Suite 500, West Palm Beach, Florida 33401 (Hereinafter Architect) has made an agreement (under the terms and conditions of the Prime Agreement for Architectural/Professional Services dated October 20, 2015 (and Ammendment-1, October 20, 2020).

This proposal is being submitted under the terms of the above noted Prime Agreement.

This work will be performed Architect in conjunction with our sub-consultant. Architect will be facilitating sub-consultant coordination as part of the project deliverable.

#### I. PROJECT SCOPE

Provide Professional Services associated with the Renewal / Replacement of the existing 2nd. Floor exterior mezzanine walkways and canopies in the Courtyard Area between the A and B Buildings at the Main Detention Center. Scope includes R/R of deteriorated steel handrail/guardrail, replacement canopies, replacement of existing wall mounted and column mounted light fixtures, apply traffic coating to mezzanine walkways.

At the County's discretion, scope may include the replacement of the exterior wall finish system to match the new "Wooden" product assembly which has been applied to the south elevation of the A-Building as part of the PBSO HQ Renovation. It is understood that product lead times may remove this from consideration.

Provide Professional Services associated with the Renewal / Replacement of the existing integral gutter running along the covered walkway above the ground floor level (Location runs along north elevation of B-Building and the west elevation of the Central Energy Plant.

#### II. PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AND DELIVERABLES

The following bullet points highlight discussions related to project scope as well as tasks the Design Team will be performing as per this proposal:

- As per request of the County Leo A Daly had their Structural Engineering consultant perform a Structural Assessment of the existing open stair and mezzanine walkways between the A and B-Buildings at the Main Detention Center. This task was executed and issued to the County and Contractor in its final form on May 4, 2023.
- As a continuation of the next steps moving forward, the County requested the Design Team submit a proposal for the Renewal / Replacement and remediation of the following (in the above noted area):
  - o Replace the existing mezzanine level canopy (which the covering fabric only was demo'd / removed as part of the A-Building PBSO HQ Renovation Project) over the 2<sup>nd</sup>. Level mezzanine area located on the east end of the courtyard between the A and B-Buildings with a new Prefinished Aluminum Canopy which will utilize the existing structural steel tube columns to the extent possible. The width of the new canopy shall span between the A building to the north and the B-Building to the south. In the east / west direction, the new canopy shall also span from the finished face of the west elevation exterior of the A-Building and slope down (4:12 pitch) to the west and will terminate just to the west edge of the north / south mezzanine walkway at the top of the courtyard stair landing.
- Existing epoxy paint will be removed to the extent possible from the existing
  concrete walking surface located at the 2<sup>nd</sup>. level exterior mezzanine walkways
  in the courtyard area. These surfaces will have a new fluid applied traffic
  coating applied to them as part of this renewal project.
- During the 3/30/23 OAC Meeting the County directed the Design Team to include J.H. – PBC CID advised there were two additional tasks that they wish to be added to part of the Courtyard Canopy scope of work:
  - #1 = Replace the canvas canopy (with like material) above the ground level north / south breezeway located along the west elevation running between A and B Buildings.
  - #2 = Replace the shorter length canvas canopy (with like material) above the 2nd. Floor level / mezzanine north / south walkway located along the west end of the courtyard between A and B Buildings.
- Provide Consultants Structural remediation details for substantially deteriorated structural elements identified in the courtyard area as part of the above noted Structural Assessment. The Structural Engineer will also provide remediation details (as necessary) for any minor items discovered during the Contractors execution of the Renewal / Replacement scope as long as they do not require engineering and design. Refer to attached proposal form the Design Team's

Structural Engineering consultant for additional narrative of proposed services (Ref. Exhibit - B).

- As per 6/30/23 conversation with the County, the existing wall and column mounted light fixtures in the area are quite deteriorated and shall be replaced as part of this Renewal / Replacement scope. Leo A Daly will have our Electrical Consultant prepare drawings depicting new light fixtures to replace the existing wall and column mounted light fixtures located along the exterior walls (and steel columns) of A and B-Buildings which face the courtyard area. Refer to consultant proposal identified as Exhibit C for additional narrative associated with this task.
- During the 7/11/23 On-Site OAC Meeting the County directed the Design Team to include remediation of the existing integral gutter running along the covered walkway above the ground floor level. The "L-Shaped" covered walkway runs in an East / West orientation along the north face of B-Building (Beginning just east of Gridline 9.4, Ref. Exhibit D) and runs to the West elevation of the Central Energy Plant where it turns north at 90 degrees and terminates at the north face of the Central Energy Plant. The integral gutter is wrapped in an EIFS false beam and soffit around light-gauge exterior metal stud framing (Ref. Exhibit F). As per County direction, the R/R will be like for like as they are comfortable with the existing detail. In the replicated detail, Leo A Daly will note the replacement metal stud framing associated with this renewal / replacement shall be by a third-party Specialty Engineer Registered in the State of Florida.
- During the 7/11/23 On-Site OAC Meeting Leo A Daly advise the County, that if
  they elect to replace of paint the existing metal ceiling panels located at the
  underside of the existing mezzanine walkway, they would be able to do so as
  part of deferred maintenance. If the County elects to replace the existing metal
  ceiling panels with a "hard lid" ceiling composed of Densglass Gold Sheathing
  with a trowel applied finish, they were advised that the Authority Having
  Jurisdiction would require the exterior framing be engineered by a third-party
  Specialty Engineer Registered in the State of Florida. This "hard lid" ceiling
  would also require access panels in locations to be determined.
- It is assumed that any "temporary canopies" (As depicted on sheet AE110H,
   Exhibit D) identified above the second floor existing door openings associated
   with the A-Building and B-Building will not be part of the project scope.
- The replacement of the existing roofing system and coping cap of the B-Building is not included as part of the scope of professional services associated with this Renewal / Replacement project scope. The Design Team will however detail for the addition on a Pre-finished aluminum coping cap (to match the one utilized on A-Building) over the existing precast stone coping cap running east/west along the north elevation of B-Building. This should help to minimize the potential for water infiltration entering into the exterior wall system which is thought to be entering through the vertical grouted joints between the precast stone coping cap as the existing roofing membrane does not appear to continue

up and over the parapet wall as is common practice in current roofing applications.

- In order to clarify and address questions which were raised by the Contractor during the development of this scope Leo A Daly has furnished response to these inquiries (Ref. Exhibit – F).
- Refer to attached Consultant Proposals Exhibit's B & C for expanded narrative of professional services.

#### Deliverable Schedule:
