I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to:

- A) receive and file the following Notices of Grant Award/Fund Availability (NFA) from Florida Department of Commerce (FDOC):
 - NFA #042976 (Federal Award Identification Number (FAIN) G-2302FLLIEE, CFDA 93.568), dated March 3, 2025, for Program Year (PY) 2023 allocation, in the amount not-to-exceed \$4,804,793, with a release of \$2,589,146 to add to the previous release of \$2,215,647, and to edit the program period end date from September 30, 2025 to August 31, 2025, for the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP);
 - 2. NFA #043005 (FAIN G-2302FLLIEI, CFDA 93.568), dated March 3, 2025, for PY 2023 allocation, in the amount not-to-exceed \$262,428, and to extend the program period end date from September 30, 2024 to August 31, 2025, for LIHEAP; and
- B) **approve** a Budget Amendment in the amount of \$262,428 in the LIHEAP Fund to align the budget to the actual grant award.

Summary: On June 15, 2021, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) ratified the Mayor's signature on the Federally Funded Subgrant Umbrella Agreement #E2016 (R2021-0783) (CFDA No.93.568 and 93.569) with the FDOC, for the period October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2023, for the LIHEAP and Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) programs. The Umbrella Agreement was subsequently amended on February 25, 2022, August 16, 2023, and July 1, 2024. Under the terms of the new umbrella agreement, FDOC will issue a NFA for each program award and will issue amendments to NFAs for any changes or increases in funding. Electric bill assistance will be provided to approximately 7,000 low-income individuals and 2,800 families during Fiscal Year (FY) 2025. In Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2024, 2,859 households received electric bill assistance. **No County match is required.** <u>Countywide (HH)</u>

Background and Justification: Since 1992, the Community Action Program has administered LIHEAP, which provides utility assistance and restoration services to individuals and households living in Palm Beach County.
