Background and Policy Issues: Neither such TFR nor any other airspace restriction was active over Mar-A-Largo when the President was not in residence. The FAA recently established a new flight restriction that prohibits all operations within a one (1) mile radius of Mar-A-Lago below 2,000 feet at all times except as authorized by air traffic control, even when the President is not in residence. As a result of this new restriction, all departures from PBI to the east are being directed to turn toward the northeast upon departure. This has resulted in a substantial increase in overflights experienced by residents of El Cid, Flamingo Park, and the Town of Palm Beach. Staff has outlined the legal options available to the BCC regarding the flight restrictions. If the Board chooses the first option,-authorizing staff to file a petition for review prior to the deadline to preserve the County's rights to pursue litigation against the FAA regarding the flight restriction, the petition for review must be filed by December 12, 2025. The second option would be to continue to request discussions with the FAA and USSS regarding potential modifications to the flight restrictions without initiating formal legal action. This option would result in the County losing any opportunity to file a formal legal challenge to the flight restrictions if conversations are not fruitful. Regardless of the option selected, staff recommends continued outreach to the FAA and USSS to discuss potential modifications to the flight restrictions to address community concerns.
