VENDOR SERVICE AGREEMENT

This Vendor Service Agreement, **AGR95**, between **Southeast Florida Behavioral Health Network, Inc.**, hereinafter referred to as SEFBHN, and the **Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office**, hereinafter referred to as the Provider, shall be effective April 21, 2026 until June 30, 2027.

A. Scope of Work to be Performed

The scope of work will encompass the following areas and activities:

The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office will support CORE Network goals by using its allocated funding to strengthen law-enforcement functions that help bridge individuals with substance use disorders to appropriate care. The agency's involvement emphasizes community engagement, crisis response, and linking individuals to treatment and recovery supports. Services are to be provided in compliance will be maintained with the **Managing Entity Guidance for CORE Law Enforcement and Department of Children and Families' Guidance Doc 41, Coordinated Opioid Recovery Network of Addiction Care (CORE Network)**, both of which are herein incorporated by reference.

CORE funding allows PBSO to enhance activities such as increasing public awareness of available services, improving officers' capacity to safely de-escalate substance-related crises, and expanding the referral pathways that connect individuals to community-based treatment providers.

Invoices for CORE funding will be submitted on a monthly basis utilizing the cost reimbursement invoice format including supporting documentation, as outlined below.

B. Tasks

The major tasks to be performed by the Provider will encompass providing services for substance use disorder as described in the Scope of Work above and as listed in the **Attachment A, Line Item Operating Budget**, herein incorporated by reference.

1. Budget and Compensation

The fees set by this Agreement are based upon the Scope of Work listed above.

The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office will receive **\$100,000.00 (\$100,000.00 for Fiscal Year 25/26 and, \$0.00 for Fiscal Year 26/27)**, for services rendered in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. These funds will be released on a cost reimbursement basis for CORE Services funding, as noted on the **Statement of Funding**, herein incorporated by reference.

The invoice must be submitted to SEFBHN and include purpose and description of the services performed. The Provider shall only invoice for services specified herein and have been delivered during the agreement period. The properly completed invoice

must be submitted to SEFBHN on the **Attachment B, Cost Reimbursement Invoice Template**, herein incorporated by reference, the 10th of each month. Payments will be released thereafter.

2. Data Collection and Reporting

To ensure clear accountability and transparency in the allocation and use of resources, reporting information is required at the time of invoice submission to summarize the impact of law enforcement funding for the CORE Network Quarterly Narrative Report, as follows:

- a. Expenditure amounts for each quarter
- b. Descriptions of how the funds were spent
- c. Description of type of involvement for each line item from the options below:

(1) Community Engagement

Law enforcement officers can educate the public about their CORE Network through various community engagement activities to increase awareness of services.

(2) Crisis Intervention

Officers trained in crisis intervention techniques can de-escalate situations involving individuals with a substance use disorder, providing a more compassionate approach to handling substance-related incidents.

(3) Referral Process

For individuals that may not have an immediate need, law enforcement officers can provide information about their CORE Network and refer individuals to the community-based treatment or recovery support service provider with peer specialists within their CORE Network.

(4) Collaboration with Providers

Law enforcement often partners with local health and social services agencies. Through these partnerships, officers can share relevant information, allowing the provider organizations to follow up with the individual. This could include communication through electronic referrals or dedicated liaisons between law enforcement and treatment centers provided there was written consent from the individual.

(5) Follow-up and Relationship Building

Law enforcement officers may work with behavioral health professionals or peer recovery specialists to ensure that individuals receive necessary follow-up care.

C. Terms and Conditions

Any changes to dates and fees must be submitted and approved by SEFBHN. If circumstances arise that will require additional services and time, the Provider will notify SEFBHN and obtain written agreement prior to undertaking such activities. The Provider shall perform all services, tasks and provide deliverables, including the quarterly reconciliation, and reports, as specified in this agreement.

D. Business Associates

Pursuant to the Administrative Simplification provisions of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, and Standards for the Privacy and Security of Individually Identifiable Health Information, found at 45 C.F.R. Parts 160, 162 and 164, 42 C.F.R. and as amended by the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act, (collectively, "HIPAA"), SEFBHN is required to protect certain individually identifiable health or other information ("**Protected Health Information**" or "**PHI**" including, but not limited to, PHI in an electronic form). Should SEFBHN request that the Provider share or disclose Client PHI with any of the other SEFBHN designated business associates, SEFBHN shall provide the Provider with written direction indicating the name of the entity, confirmation that such entity is a business associate with a written business associate agreement with SEFBHN and the specific information and/or data SEFBHN desires the Provider to disclose to or share with such other business associate and the Parties agree to execute any such additional agreements as necessary to complete such activities. For purposes of this Agreement, "Client" shall mean: any individual that is eligible to receive behavioral health services in accordance with DCF eligibility policies in the Service Area.

E. Governing Law and Compliance

1. Governing Law

The validity, enforceability, and interpretation of this Agreement, including the Attachments, shall be determined and governed by the laws of the State of Florida, as well as applicable federal laws. The Parties agree that jurisdiction for any dispute, action, claim or alternative dispute resolution proceeding regarding this Agreement shall reside in Okeechobee County, Florida.

2. Florida Regulatory Governance

This Agreement, the Attachments and the performance thereof, are subject to the requirements and regulations promulgated by and specific verbiage required by DCF.

3. Corporate Compliance

During the term of this Agreement, each Party shall: (i) ensure that it is duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of Florida; (ii) maintain all requisite federal, state and local authority, permits and licenses necessary or appropriate to operate and to carry out its obligations under this Agreement; (iii) monitor its performance of administrative functions on an ongoing basis to ensure compliance with applicable DCF performance standards and guidelines; and (iv) notwithstanding any term or provision in this Agreement to the contrary, remain ultimately responsible for assuring that it is operating in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances.

F. Insurance

Any insurance required of the Provider will also be applicable to any subcontractors used by the Provider. For self-insured agencies, the Managing Entity and the Department of Children and Families must be treated as additionally insured.

1. The Provider shall maintain continuous adequate liability insurance coverage during the existence of this Contract and any renewal(s) and extension(s) thereof. With the exception of a state agency or subdivision as defined by subsection 768.28(2), F.S., by execution of this Contract, the Provider accepts full responsibility for identifying and determining the type(s) and extent of liability insurance necessary to provide reasonable financial protections for the Provider and the persons served to be served under this Contract. The Managing Entity and its Network Service Providers at all tiers are not covered by the State of Florida Risk Management Trust Fund for liability created by s. 284.30, F.S
2. Upon the execution of this Contract, the Provider shall furnish the Managing Entity written verification supporting both the determination and existence of such insurance coverage and shall furnish verification of renewal or replacement thereof prior to the expiration or cancellation. The Managing Entity reserves the right to require additional insurance as specified in this Contract.
3. The Provider shall notify the Managing Entity within 30 calendar days if there is a modification to the terms of insurance including but not limited to, cancellation, nonrenewal, or modification to policy limits.
4. The Provider shall obtain and provide proof to the Managing Entity and the Department of Comprehensive General Liability Insurance (broad form coverage), specifically including premises, fire and legal liability to cover the Provider and all its employees. The limits of the Provider's coverage shall be no less than \$300,000 per occurrence with a minimal annual aggregate of no less than \$1,000,000.

The Provider shall secure and maintain, and ensure subcontractors secure and maintain, Commercial General Liability Insurance, including bodily injury, property damage, personal and advertising injury, and products and completed operations. This insurance will provide coverage for all claims that may arise from the services completed under this Contract, whether such services are by the Provider or anyone employed by it. Such insurance shall include the State as an additional insured for the entire length of this Contract. The Provider shall maintain required limits of liability necessary to provide reasonable financial protections to the Provider, the Managing Entity, and the Department of Children and Families under this Contract.

5. If in the course of the performance of its duties under this Contract any officer, employee, or agent of the Provider operates a motor vehicle, the Managing Entity shall cause the Provider, at all tiers, to obtain and provide proof to the ME and the Department of comprehensive automobile liability insurance coverage with limits no less than \$300,000 per occurrence with a minimal annual aggregate of no less than \$1,000,000.
6. If in the course of the performance of the duties of any Provider, at all tiers, any officer, employee, or agent of the Provider, provides any professional services or provides or administers any prescription drug or medication or controlled substance, the ME shall cause the Provider, at all tiers, to obtain and provide proof to the ME and the Department of professional liability insurance coverage, including medical malpractice liability and errors and omissions coverage, to cover all employees and shall not exclude claims resulting from physical and sexual abuse. The limits of the coverage shall be no less than \$300,000 per occurrence with a minimal annual aggregate of no less than \$1,000,000.
7. The Managing Entity and the Department of Children and Families shall be exempt from, and in no way liable for, any sums of money that may represent a deductible or self-insured retention under any such insurance. The payment of any deductible on any policy shall be the sole responsibility of the Provider purchasing the insurance.
8. All insurance policies, at all tiers, shall be provided by insurers licensed or eligible to do and that are doing business in the State of Florida. Each insurer must have a minimum rating of "A" by A. M. Best or an equivalent rating by a similar insurance rating firm, and shall name the Managing Entity and the Department as an additional insured under the policy or policies. The Provider shall use its best good faith efforts to cause the insurers issuing all such general, automobile, and professional liability insurance to use a policy form with additional insured provisions naming both DCF and the ME as additional insured or a form of additional insured endorsement acceptable to ME in the reasonable exercise of its judgment. The ME reserves the right to require additional insurance. The limits of coverage under each policy maintained by the Provider do not limit the Provider's liability and obligations under this contract. Upon the ME's request, the Provider shall furnish the ME with written verification supporting the existence of such insurance coverage.

9. All insurance policies will be with insurers authorized, and through insurance agents licensed, to transact business in the State, as required by chapter 624, F.S., or upon approval of the Managing Entity with a commercial self-insurance trust fund authorized under §624.462, F.S. The Provider shall provide thirty (30) calendar days written notice of cancellation of any insurance required herein to the Managing Entity. The Provider shall submit certificates of insurance coverage, or other evidence of insurance coverage acceptable to the Managing Entity, prior to this Contract execution, and provide the Managing Entity 10 days prior Notice of any cancellation or nonrenewal.
10. All such insurance proposed by the Provider shall be submitted to and confirmed by the assigned Primary Point of Contact no later than execution initially and thereafter, updates shall be provided annually which reflect no lapse in insurance coverage.
11. To the extent and degree required by the law, the Provider shall self-insure or maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance (WCI) covering its employees connected with the services provided hereby.
12. The Provider will, for itself if providing Cyber/Network solutions or handling confidential information, secure and maintain liability insurance, written on an occurrence basis, covering civil, regulatory, and statutory damages; contractual damages; data breach management exposure; and, any loss of income or extra expense as a result of actual or alleged breach, violation or infringement of right to privacy, consumer data protection law, confidentiality or other legal protection for personal information within minimum limits.

G. General Provisions

1. Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, the Parties acknowledge and agree that each Party is subject to the Florida Public Records Act under the Florida Contract and under Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. Nonetheless, in the event that a Party becomes legally compelled to disclose any of the Confidential Proprietary Information (the "Compelled Party"), the Compelled Party will provide the other Party with prompt notice thereof so that the other Party may seek a protective order or other appropriate remedy. In the event that such protective order or other remedy is not obtained by the other Party, the Compelled Party will furnish or cause to be furnished only that minimum portion of the Confidential Proprietary Information which the Compelled Party is legally required to furnish.
2. **Public Records**
 - a. SEFBHN and Provider shall comply with the provisions of Chapter 119, Fla. Stat. (Public Records Law), in connection with this Agreement and shall provide access to public records in accordance with §119.0701, Fla. Stat. and more specifically Provider shall:

- b. Keep and maintain public records required by the County to perform the Agreement.
- c. Upon request from the County's custodian of public records, provide the County with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Fla. Stat. or as otherwise provided by law.
- d. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the Agreement term and following completion of the Agreement if SEFBHN does not transfer the records to the County.
- e. Upon completion of the Agreement, transfer, at no cost, to the County all public records in possession of SEFBHN or keep and maintain public records required by the County to perform the Agreement. If the SEFBHN transfers all public records to the County upon completion of the Agreement, the SEFBHN shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the SEFBHN keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the Agreement, the SEFBHN shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the County, upon request from the County's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the County.
- f. **IF THE PROVIDER HAS QUESTIONS REGARDING THE APPLICATION OR CHAPTER 119, F.S., TO THE PROVIDER'S DUTY TO PROVIDE PUBLIC RECORDS RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT, CONTACT THE CUSTODIAN OF PUBLIC RECORDS, MS. - g. Failure to comply with the requirements of this Article shall be deemed a default as defined under the terms of this Agreement and constitute grounds for termination.

3. Severability

The illegality, unenforceability or ineffectiveness of any provision of this Agreement shall not affect the legality, enforceability or effectiveness of any other provision of this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement, or the application thereof shall, for any reason and to any extent, be deemed invalid or unenforceable, neither the remainder of this Agreement, nor the application of the provision to other persons,

entities or circumstances, nor any other instrument referred to in this Agreement shall be affected thereby, but instead shall be enforced to the maximum extent permitted by law.

5. Authority to Bind

By signature below, each signatory represents and warrants that such person is duly authorized to enter into this Agreement on the respective Party's behalf, and is duly authorized to bind such Party to the terms applicable to each.

6. Typewritten or Handwritten Provisions

Typewritten or handwritten provisions that are inserted, in this Agreement or attached to this Agreement as addenda or riders shall not be valid unless such provisions are initialed by both signatories to this Agreement.

7. Counterparts: Facsimile Execution and Captions

This Agreement may be executed and delivered: (a) in any number of counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original, but all of which together will constitute one and the same instrument; and/or (b) by facsimile, in which case the instruments so executed and delivered shall be binding and effective for all purposes; and/or (c) by email communication to the parties identified in the Notice section. The captions in this Agreement are for reference purposes only and shall not affect the meaning of terms and provisions herein.

8. Entire Agreement

This Agreement, including the Attachments A and B hereto, contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties regarding the subject matter of this Agreement. Any prior agreements, promises, negotiations or representations of or between the Parties, either oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this Agreement, which are not expressly set forth in this Agreement are null and void and of no further force or effect.

Certification Regarding Eligibility to Contract

- A. The Managing Entity shall not subcontract for Behavioral Health Services with any person or entity which:
1. Is barred, suspended, or otherwise prohibited from doing business with any government entity, or has been barred, suspended, or otherwise prohibited from doing business with any government entity in accordance with s. 287.133, F.S.;
 2. Is under investigation or indictment for criminal conduct, or has been convicted of any crime which would adversely reflect on its ability to provide services, or which adversely reflects its ability to properly handle public funds;
 3. Has had a contract terminated by the Department for failure to satisfactorily perform or for cause;
 4. Has failed to implement a corrective action plan approved by the Department or any other governmental entity, after having received due notice; or
 5. Is ineligible for contracting pursuant to the standards in s. 215.473(2), F.S.
- B. Regardless of the amount of the subcontract, the Managing Entity shall immediately terminate the subcontract for cause, if at any time during the lifetime of the subcontract, the Provider is:
1. Found to have submitted a false certification under s. 287.135, F.S., or
 2. Is placed on the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List or
 3. Is placed on the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List, or

Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion Contracts/Subcontracts

This certification is required by the regulations implementing Executive Order 12549, Debarment and Suspension, signed February 18, 1986. The guidelines were published in the May 29, 1987 Federal Register (52 Fed. Reg., pages 20360 - 20369).

A. Instructions

6. The provider further agrees by submitting this certification that it will require each subcontractor of this contract/subcontract, whose payment will equal or exceed \$25,000 in federal moneys, to submit a signed copy of this certification.
